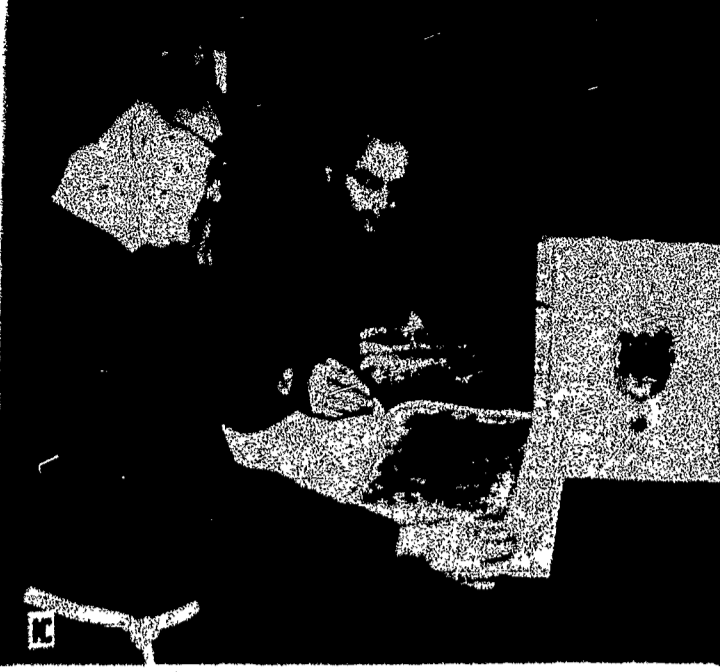


Bulldogs Seek Cage Contacts

(Continued from Page 1) not dispersions, but men who know just where they stand, who know what they hold, and what they do not, who know their creed so well, that they can give an account of it, who know so much history that they can defend it. I want an intelligent, well-instructed laity. From following this challenge the position of the Church in English speaking countries has changed from a hardly tolerated institution to that of a city of light seated on the mountain.

As a practical conclusion to his review the speaker recommended Catholic books as gifts for Christmas. "Many of Newman's works are difficult for the average layman, although the present position he would find a delight. Among the best of the popular writers are Arnold Lunn, Chesterton and Belloc. An hour in the book section of a Catholic book store would solve many a Christmas gift problem."
