2nd Clothing Drive List Brings Total to 33 Tons

Contributions of clothing, shoes, blankets and other items by 64 parishes of Rochester Diocese, totaling approximately 33 tons, have been reported thus far in the Thanksgiving Week Clothing Campaign for Korea war sufferers.
