Miss Cecilia M. Yawman Rites Held At St. Joseph's

Final tributes to Miss Cecilia M. Yawman whose outstanding work in Catholic circles brought her the Papal Cross "Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice," was paid at funeral rites held Wednesday, Jan. 3, at 10:30 a.m. at St. Joseph's Church.

Miss Yawman, 65, of 1915 Park Ave. died Dec. 31, 1950 at her residence after an illness of only two days.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated at St. Joseph's by the Rev. Joseph C. Winicki, C.S.R., assisted by the Rev. Matthew A. Tobin, C.S.R., as Deacon and the Rev. John G. Crowell, C.S.R., as Subdeacon.

Also in the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, P.A., V.G., the Very Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, the Rev. Leo G. Schwab, the Rev. George J. Weinman, the Rev. Leo C. Moon, the Rev. Arthur E. Raligan and the Rev. George V. Fredmore.

Bearers were Philip Heiselt, Thomas Heiselt, Stephan Hahn, Thomas Hahn, Gerard Hahn and Robert Hahn.

An enthusiastic, zealous worker for the Church, Miss Yawman devoted her full time in many fields. She was a pioneer in Catholic women's organization work. She was the founder and the first president of the Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women which banded together all women's groups in the diocese.

REPRESENTING SOME 20,000 women she was able to fight birth control and other measures opposed to the Church's teaching. Miss Yawman was one of the founders and an early president of the Catholic Women's Club and active in the development of the group's clubhouse.

Because of her devotion and activities, she was chosen one of five Catholic women in the diocese in 1932 to receive the papal decoration, "Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice" from Pope Pius XI. The award was presented to her by the late Bishop John Francis O'Brien at a dinner in Columbus Civic Center on May 25, 1932.

For several years, Miss Yawman served on the national board of the National Council of Catholic Women.

Active in the Catholic Women's Federation, she was one of the founders of an organization that developed into the present Catholic Charities. She was one of the founders of the St. Elizabeth Guild which donates to the support of the home.

UPON COMPLETION of her studies at the Academy of the Sacred Heart in Rochester for four years with the Madames of the Sacred Heart at the convent school in Beauvais, France. She

A charter member of St. Augustine's Parish, Mrs. Stoltz was president of the Rosary Society for a number of years. She was the perennial chairman of the traditional Rosary Society suppers at St. Augustine's. She was a member of Branch 781, Ladies Catholic Benevolent Association and in her charity assisted dozens of needy families.

She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. John L. Haag, Rochester, with whom she made her home; a son, Raymond E. Stoltz, Garden City, Long Island; two sisters, Mrs. Frederick Valentine, Los Angeles, Calif. and Mrs. James R. Norton, Jamaica, Long Island, 4 grandchildren.

Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, where services were conducted by the Rev. Bartholome L. Quirk.

Among many other activities, Miss Yawman was a board director of the Lewis Street Settlement House, a member of the Big Sister Council of Camp Madonna and a member of the Ladies Auxiliary of St. Joseph's Church.

She leaves three sisters, Mrs. M. Aloysia Yawman of Rochester, Sister Gabrielle de St. Rose of the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor, Cincinnati and Mrs. Frank W. Lahn of Rochester; a brother, Victor J. Yawman of Rochester.
