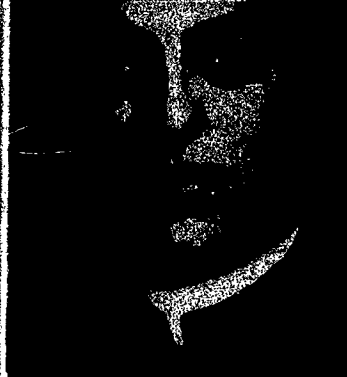
Nurses Slate Dinner Talk By Msgr. Toomey

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph B. Toomey, national spiritual director of the National Council of Catholic Nurses will speak at the banquet of Rochester Council, in honor of His Excellency Bishop Kearney at Levan's, Chestnut St. on Monday, Jan. 15 at 6 p.m. The nurses are honoring the Most Reverend Bishop through whose encouragement and guidance, the council was formed in 1942.

Monsignor Toomey who is a graduate of Notre Dame University and made his theological studies at St. Bernard's Seminary is diocesan director of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Syracuse.

After graduating from St. Bernard's, he was ordained in St. Patrick's Cathedral Rochester on June 7, 1930. Monsignor Toomey has been honored by national and state organizations and agencies. He is past president of the National Conference of Catholic Charities and a past president of the New York State Conference on Social Work. He was appointed a member of the New York State Citizens' Committee of the White House Conference by President Truman and was named by Governor Dewey as a member of the Board of visitors of the Syracuse State School.

Mr. Shamon was the father of the Rev. Albert J. Shamon, of St. Andrew's faculty and of the Rev. Edward A. Shamon, assistant pastor, St. Agnes Church, Avon. He is survived by his wife Nettie, the two priests-sons, another son, George B. Shamon, Auburn's City Clerk and five daughters, Elizabeth, Marie, Lillian, Mrs. Eugene Ferrari and Mrs. John Halock.

He had eight grandchildren and several nieces and nephews. Mr. Shamon was a native of Beirut, Lebanon but had lived most of his life in Auburn. At one time he conducted a clothing store in State St. and had a branch store in Oneida.

He was a member of the Holy Name Society of St. Aloysius Church and Auburn Council, Knights of Columbus.
