



## Nurses Slate Dinner Talk By Msgr. Toomey

The Rev. Msgr. Joseph B. Toomey, national spiritual director of the National Council of Catholic Nurses will speak at the banquet of Rochester Council, in honor of His Excellency Bishop Kearney, at Leavenworth, Cheektowaga, on Monday, Jan. 15 at 6 p.m. The nurses are honoring the Most Reverend Bishop through whose encouragement and guidance, the council was formed in 1942.

Monsignor Toomey who is a graduate of Notre Dame University and made his theological studies at St. Bernard's Seminary is diocesan director of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Syracuse.

He completed his sociology studies at Fordham University.

AFTER GRADUATING from St. Bernard's, he was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral Rochester on June 7, 1930.

Monsignor Toomey has been honored by national and state organizations and agencies. He is past president of the National Conference of Catholic Charities and a past president of the New York State Conference on Social Work.

He was appointed a member of the New York State Citizens' Committee of the White House Conference by President Truman and was named by Governor Dewey as a member of the Board of Visitors of the Syracuse State School.

The Syracuse prelate is also a member of the standing committee of the Diocesan Directors of the National Conference of Catholic Charities and a member of the Board of Directors of the Syracuse Community Chest.

Mrs. Helen Wilkie is general chairman of the banquet committee and Miss Helen Dodd is in charge of publicity.

Mr. Shammon was the father of the Rev. Vincent LaFrome, assistant pastor of St. Andrew's Church and new spiritual director of the parish Holy Name Society, will be honored guest at the annual corned beef and cabbage supper of the Society at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 16, in the school hall.
