

Teachers' College Status Told Brockport H. N. Men

Members of the Brockport State Teachers' College and other groups were invited to a talk by Dr. Michael Auletta of the school's department of education at the meeting of the Holy Name Society of the Church of the Nativity, B.V.M., in Holger Hall on Jan. 10.

Dr. Auletta brought out the value of the college in the community and the gratitude for cooperation on the part of the public.

Questioning that nearly half a million dollars be spent annually on maintaining the school, the speaker stated that the New York State colleges that are run on similar budgets than is Brockport.

He defended teachers' colleges against recent criticisms in a national magazine and told many of the advantages of a publicly financed system of teacher education such as that of New York State.

Questioning of the speaker produced evidence of his listeners' eagerness for courses in the field of adult education as well as their interest in learning more of the workings of the Brockport institution.

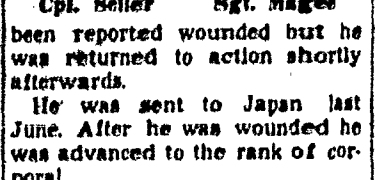

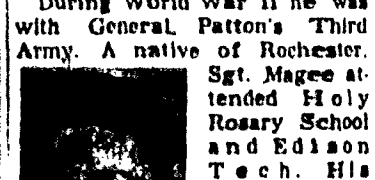
During World War II he was with General Patton's Third Army. A native of Rochester.
