Elmirans Will Inspect New Convent Sun.

Announcement was made in St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira last Sunday that the new convent for the Sisters would be ready for "open house" on Sunday, Jan. 28. The new convent, under construction for the last six months, is located on High Street opposite St. Peter and Paul's School.

Parishioners and friends will be welcome to inspect the new building from 2 until 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon. Friends and Sisters, and members of the Immaculate Heart and Holy Name Societies of the parish will serve on the reception committee.

THE NEW CONVENT, costing approximately \$75,000, was built to house the eight Sisters of St. Joseph who teach in St. Peter and Paul's School. Plans were drawn early last Spring under the direction of Rev. William J. Naughton, then pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church.

Construction began early in the summer and, except for a few delays due to difficulty in obtaining scarce materials and fixtures, progress was steady. The building, now practically complete, is equipped with the latest in modern plumbing and heating facilities and is comfortably furnished.

The present pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, the Rev. Hubert A. Blaky, who succeeded Father Naughton in July of last year, paid tribute last week to everyone who had a part in the planning and construction of the new convent.

HE PRAISED especially the foresight of Father Naughton, who for some time had realized that the present quarters of the Sisters were inadequate and promptly made plans to provide them with a new home.

General Contractors for the new convent were the Mitchell Bros. of Elmira, headed by Charles J. Mitchell. The architect was Leo E. Considine of the local firm of Haskell, Considine and Haskell. Other local contractors were: Charles A. Unold, electric wiring; C. E. Evans Corp., heating; Hog-Nichols, Inc., plumbing.

Friends of 'Father Baker' To Make Rome Pilgrimage

Buffalo — A national pilgrimage sponsored by Friends of Father Baker, founder of the Basilica of Our Lady of Victory at Lackawanna, will sail from New York April 14 in the R.M.S. Queen Mary of the Cunard Line. It was announced here.

The pilgrimage, approved by Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., Bishop of Buffalo, will be led by Rev. Joseph McPherson, superintendent of Father Baker's Homes of Charity at Lackawanna.

THE PILGRIMS will retrace the steps of Father Baker who in 1874 as a seminarian made a pilgrimage to Paris, Lourdes and Rome. Father McPherson announced that American Express-Catholic Travel League had been appointed to handle all arrangements for the major pilgrimage. Inquiries should be addressed to Father McPherson. In Paris, the members will assist at a special Mass in memory of Father Baker to be celebrated in the Basilica of Notre Dame Des Victoires (Our Lady of Victory). It was here in 1874 that Father Baker, then a seminarian, dedicated his life to Our Lady of Victory.

A special memorial Mass will also be celebrated for Father Baker in the Miraculous Grotto at Lourdes, on the spot where Our Lady appeared to Ste. Bernadette in 1858. Father Baker also visited Lourdes on his pilgrimage and when he built the Basilica at Lackawanna, he dedicated Lourdes, reproducing in miniature
