

First Chaplains' Spiritual Retreat Lists 2 From Here

A priest of the Diocese of Rochester and a prelate who is a native of Rochester participated in a half-day spiritual retreat at Carle's Barracks, Pa., taking time off from classes and other duties.

Among the ten Catholic chaplains of the staff and student body at the Joint Army-Air Force Chaplains School were the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Joseph W. Kohn (colored), school commandant, a native of Rochester, who directed the retreat and the Rev. Joseph A. Natale, a priest of the Rochester Diocese.

Each priest celebrated Mass to begin the retreat, and then the chaplains recited Matins and Lauds. Three meditation periods were held under the direction of the Rev. James L. Harley, S. J. of Meranton. A Holy Hour with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament concluded the services. This was the first time a retreat of this nature was scheduled at the school.

Georgian Court Head 40 Years Dies At 79

North Plainfield, N. J.—Mother Mary John, dean and later president of Georgian Court College for 40 years until her retirement three years ago, died here (February 7) of a heart ailment in the Motherhouse of the Sisters of Mercy. She was 79.

Mother Mary John received a bachelor of arts degree with the first class in the graduation from Mount St. Mary's College here, which later became Georgian Court. She served as dean of the college for 32 years. In 1924 the college was moved from North Plainfield to Lakewood, N. J., and its name changed to Georgian Court. Mother Mary John became president in 1940.
