

Nazareth Books Lecture By Dr. Kuehnelt-Leddihn

Dr. Erik Kuehnelt-Leddihn, philosopher, historian, and sociologist, will speak to Nazareth College students on "The Outlook in Europe," Wednesday afternoon, Feb. 28 in the college auditorium. This lecture is one in a series of student lectures arranged for this collegiate year.

Dr. Leddihn is known to the readers of Catholic periodicals under the pseudonyms of Francis Stuart Campbell and George Francis Barry. Two of his books, "Night Over the East" and "Gates of Hell," both journalistic novels, have received wide acclaim.

AUTHOR, NEWSPAPERMAN, correspondent and lecturer, he came to the United States in 1937 from a cosmopolitan European background. A Hungarian by birth, he received his early education in Baden, Austria, the general headquarters of the Austro-Hungarian army during the first World War.

At ten he visited Denmark, at twelve he spent a summer in England; at sixteen he was the Vienna correspondent for the London Spectator; at twenty he was in Moscow as correspondent for a Hungarian daily.

He lived in one European country after another, including a year in Lapland, some time in Helsinki, Sofia and Cordu. His contacts were not only with statesmen and scholars but with political conspirators, hoboes and peasants.

He speaks Hungarian, Russian and Japanese; his native language is French; his Ph.D. is from the Hungarian University at Budapest; he taught Japanese at Fordham; and studied law and theology in German at Vienna.

With the market for his writings closed by the National Socialist regime in Germany, he turned to teaching. For a year he was on the faculty of an English college. From 1937 to 1938 he taught Geopolitics at Georgetown University and from there he transferred to St. Peter's College in Jersey City, where he is still Chairman of the Department of History and Sociology.

In spite of his busy career as a writer and lecturer—he gives two series of lectures each year, one in North America and one in Europe—he continues as correspondent for English, American, German and Austrian publications.

Dr. Leddihn is considered one of the ablest and most challenging Catholic scholars on the lecture platform today. His formal talk will be followed by a discussion period, in which the student body will participate.

Catholic War Veterans Hear Fr. Murphy

Eternal vigilance and sacrifice in defense of the rights of God and country was urged at the fifth annual Communion breakfast of the Monroe County Catholic War Veterans and Auxiliary on Sunday, Feb. 11, in the Powers Hotel.

Speaker was the Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of the St. John Fisher College for Men, whose address followed the presentation of awards to two persons as outstanding Catholics last year.

The breakfast followed Low Mass in St. Joseph's Church after which His Excellency Bishop Kearney stressed that the significance of the Altar received on Ash Wednesday must remain throughout Lent.

The ashes on the forehead are a symbol, like the uniform, of the fight that must be waged against evil. Success in the fight will come from prayer and self-denial, the Bishop said. The Blue Cavets, drill company, escorted the Bishop.

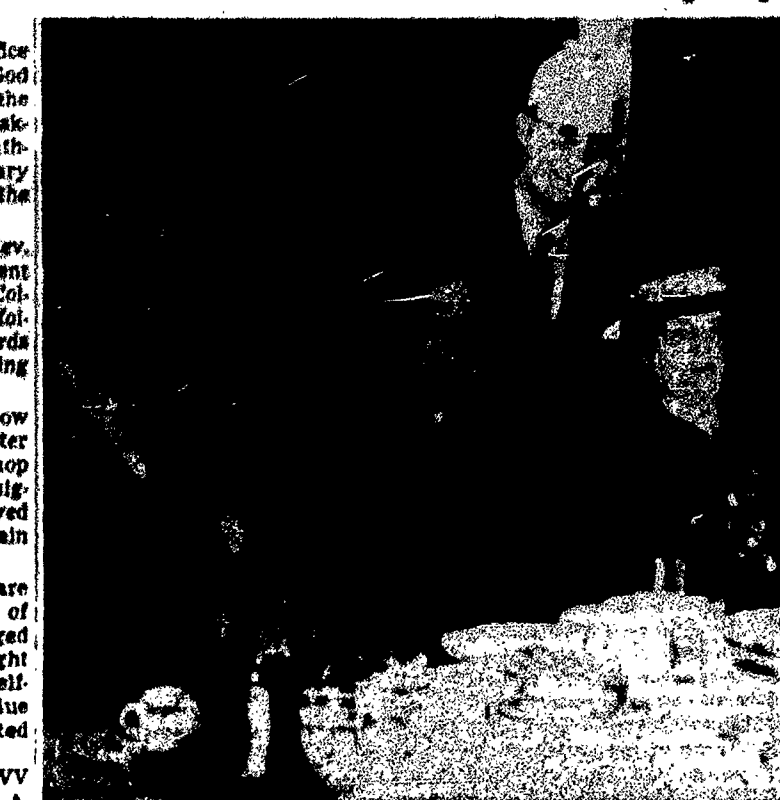
Chosen for this year's CWV awards were Mrs. Louis A. Whalen, first president of the Rochester Diocese Council of Catholic Women, and Thomas H. O'Connor, veteran news editor of the Catholic Courier Journal. It was the first year that the organization gave an award to a woman.

Mrs. Whalen was presented a plaque by Mrs. William Shea, CWV Auxiliary president, who cited the recipient's outstanding record of organizational activity while rearing a family of 11 children.

Former CWV County Commander Edward Esce hailed the three-decade Catholic press and organizational activities of O'Connor, who was presented the CWV medal by Carl Nanni, county commander. Similar medals were given in past years to John T. Nothnagle, James P. B. Duffy and Frank R. Davis.

ENROLLMENT is now in process for the new St. John Fisher College. Father Murphy told the veterans, declaring that the institution will open next September for freshmen only, with the first graduation class planned for 1955.

Pointing out that construction of the college at the junction of East Avenue and Fairport Road is proceeding, the youthful Basilian educator declared: "Now, finally, the dream that originated in the mind of His Excellency Bishop Kearney is

reaching reality. While these are troubled and difficult times, we have every hope that this newest educational decoration of Holy Mother Church will be a worthwhile job for God and country.

"There is one fascinating thing—generations yet unborn will profit by your vision and generosity. The foundations we lay, please God, with your good prayers will be sound, firm and lasting."

Offering "the courage and faith" of St. John Fisher as a model for Catholic war veterans, Father Murphy said "the ominous war clouds of 1951 should not mean despair and helplessness. God stands with us. Each day that sees the absence of World War III I feel is a tribute to the generosity of the Mother of God. Let us guard our faith and our freedom and, please God, we shall not have lived in vain."

Referring to the more than 20,000 volumes bequeathed to the college by the late Rev. Bernard J. Geffell of East Rochester, Father Murphy said "the State Education Department is amazed that we are starting with such an auspicious library.

Brief remarks were made by the Rev. William F. Nolan, County CWV chaplain, and the Rev. John S. Whalen, first chaplain. Esce was toastmaster.
