

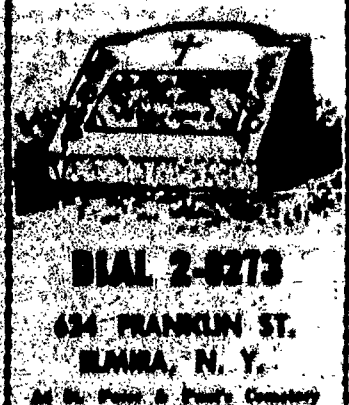
Epidemic Strikes Liverpool Catholics

Liverpool — (NC) — More than 400 Catholics have died of influenza in the past few weeks in the Liverpool area. At two cemeteries at least ten burials are taking place each day in the epidemic sweeping the locality.

Some 20 of the city's 4,700 Catholic members are ill, as well as a large number of students.

Fr. Cleary Leaves Armed Service, Ithaca KC Hear

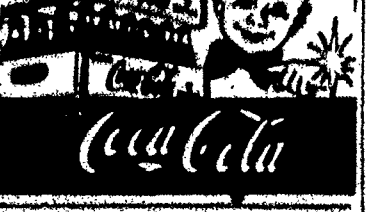
Ithaca — His return to Maryknoll missionary activity after harrowing experiences as a chaplain in Korea was told by the Rev. Patrick H. Cleary, M.S.I., of Ithaca in a letter to Thomas E. Solan, financial secretary of Ithaca Council, Knights of Columbus.

The letter was read by Solan at the Ithaca Council meeting on Feb. 8.

Father Cleary is a brother of James E. Cleary of 207 N. Albany St., here.

A Maryknoll missionary for nearly 25 years, except for war-time periods, Father Cleary in World War 2 was interned by the Japanese. In the present Korean conflict he was forced to leave his post in the face of Red aggression. He later became a chaplain with X Corps, U.S. Army but is now in the process of separation from service.

NCCW Value To Affiliated Unit Told At Hammondsport

Hammondsport — The value of the National Council of Catholic Women was emphasized by three speakers at the St. Gabriel's Rosary Society here on Feb. 5.

The origin of the NCCW and its channels to the laywomen through the Diocesan and Deanery Units were told by the Rev. Daniel Hogan, Corning, Deanery Moderator. He explained the organization's service to parish and to the affiliated society.

FATHER HOGAN spoke on the Cana Conference planned for Hammondsport on Feb. 1. He explained that the Conference was held to show married couples what they already possess and to reveal how easy it is to keep their marriage as it was from the time of the ceremony.
