(Continued from Page 1) in Rochester. She was a life-long member of St. Bridget's Church and a pew-holder for 65 years. She was a life-long member of the Rosary Society of her parish and a member of the Catholic Women's Club. She had been one of the first to graduate from St. Bridget's School.

Mrs. Foery was present in Old St. Patrick's Cathedral where her son was ordained on June 10, 1916. When her son on June 1, 1937 was preparing to celebrate Mass at Holy Rosary Church where he was pastor, he was given word of his appointment to the See of Syracuse. Completing the Mass he first conveyed the good news to his mother at home.

Mrs. Foery occupied the front pew on the epistle side of old St. Patrick's Cathedral on August 13, 1937 when her son was solemnly consecrated the Bishop of Syracuse.

EVER RETIRING, this "little lady" as she was referred to by Bishop Kearney, was paid a personal visit by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman on the occasion of his visit to Rochester on Jan. 27, 1949 to open the St. John Fisher College campaign.

Besides Bishop Foery, Mrs. Foery is survived by another son, Frank; two daughters, Miss Florence Foery and Miss Loretta Foery, all of Rochester and several nieces and nephews.

Bishop Meyers Named Coadjutor In Westminster

Vatican City (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has named Bishop Edward Meyers, one of the Auxiliary Bishops of His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, to be Coadjutor "in the See."

Formerly Titular Bishop of Larnus, Bishop Meyers has been elevated to Titular Archbishop of Berea. By virtue of this appointment, he would remain in office in case of the Cardinal's death during the time the See is vacant and until a new occupant is named by the Holy Father. This would not be true of an Auxiliary.
