Diocesan-Wide Sodality Sessions Set At Aquinas

The day's activities will open with Mass at 9:30 a.m. followed by breakfast. After introductions by the Rev. J. Joseph O'Connell, chairman of N.A.Z.A.R.E.T.H. Academy, the Rev. Francis P. LeBlanc, S.J. will address the group on "The Sodality: A Way of Life." A general discussion will follow.

FATHER LEBLANC will outline the nature of this way of life, probation for this way of life and a lifetime "Consecration" to this way of life.

Consideration of the Sodality as the answer to the modern need for holiness will be led by the Rev. Francis K. Droz, S.J.

The soldier wrote that he sustained a back injury and that his "profile was changed a little" when he was from a Red sniper knocked him off a cliff.

Tait who attended Corpus Christi School and Paul Revere School, was serving with the 7th Infantry Regiment of the 3rd Army Division. He enlisted in the Army Apr. 19, 1941, in Japan in July and has been in Korea since November. His brother, a Navy veteran of World War II, has reenlisted.
