

Nazareth Students To Hear Pianist of World Fame

Alexander Tcherepnin, internationally known pianist-composer and a member of the faculty of De Paul University School of Music, Chicago, will present a recital of his own compositions to the Nazareth College student body Tuesday Feb. 27 at 3:30 p.m. in the college auditorium, East Avenue.

One of the great composers of modern times, Alexander Tcherepnin has won world-wide acclaim for his piano compositions, his orchestral works, his chamber music, his ballets and his operas.

His compositions have been performed by leading artists and orchestral and ballet groups throughout America and Europe. His wife, Hsien-Ming Lee Tcherepnin, a noted Chinese concert pianist, is also a member of the De Paul faculty. She is a graduate of the Shanghai National Conservatory where she won a government scholarship for continued studies under Boquet at the Conservatoire Royal de Bruxelles.

While in China she headed the music department of the Shang-Tak school in Shanghai and has also taught in Paris.

Mr. Tcherepnin will play six groups, including the story of St. Therese, the Little Flower, told in music, beginning with her birth and baptism and touching other events in her life such as her entrance into Carmel, the reception of the habit, her profession and the offering of herself to Love.
