Geneva Women Urged To Sign For Defense

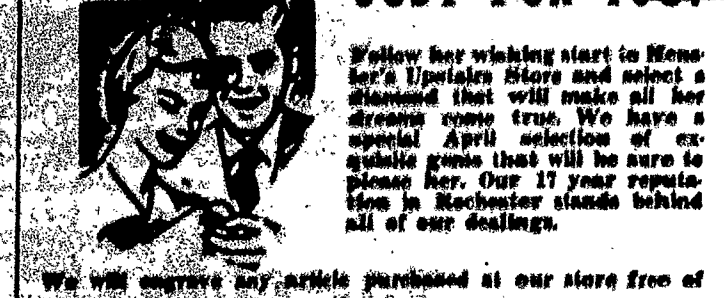
