The Sisters and the girls of Georgetown Visitation Convent in Washington, D.C., won the admiration of President Andrew Johnson early in his Administration. While Mr. Johnson was a member of the United States Senate, he sent his daughter Martha to the Visitation Convent in order that she might receive the best training in "refinement and culture."

President Johnson had too made for himself daily in his unique home, and when he observed the interest of the Visitation students he ordered that she be prepared for his guests. At the proper moment the stately woman gave a shrill cry and a tiny bell rang. The girl then had tea with the President of the United States, while the music box played a merry tune.

It is interesting to note that when Johnson was a United States Senator he delivered one of the most forceful and effective speeches in tribute to the Catholic Church and in condemnation of bigotry ever heard on the floor of Congress.

A pious practice started this Lent in the Auburn deanery in an answer to our Blessed Mother's requests, notably at Fatima that we pray the Rosary for peace and for the conversion of Russia.

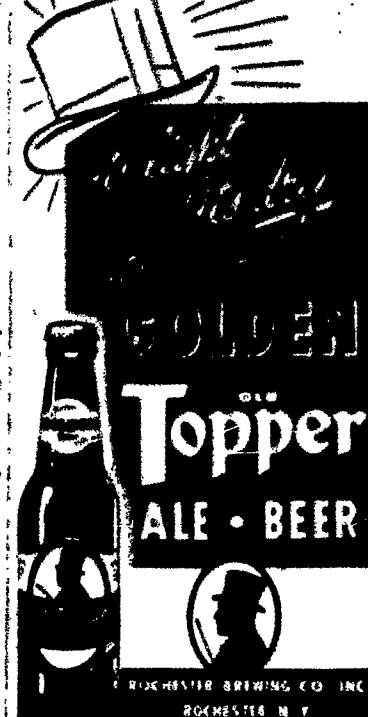
The deanery chairman of Shrines in the Home, Mrs. Harry M. Dillon, has worked out a plan whereby three women are assigned each day to say five decades of the Rosary. Each one takes a different set of mysteries so that in twenty-four hours a complete Rosary is offered up to our Blessed Lady for the intention of a just and lasting peace.

THIS PLAN is called "The Extra Rosary" because the women saying it are expected to say their assigned five decades over and above the customary Rosary they say each day.

Of course, if any group of three women wishes to say the "Extra Rosary" every day it is certainly encouraged to do so, but the plan was that each trio would have a certain day of the week or month assigned to it.

This Rosary practice leads me to write of another one—the Family Rosary. The other evening I was talking to a mother of five children ranging in age from eleven years to seven months, the latter naturally not being taken into consideration when the Family Rosary is to be planned.
