Committee are headed by Chairman Lawrence E. Hilly and Co-Chairman, Michael T. Ryan.

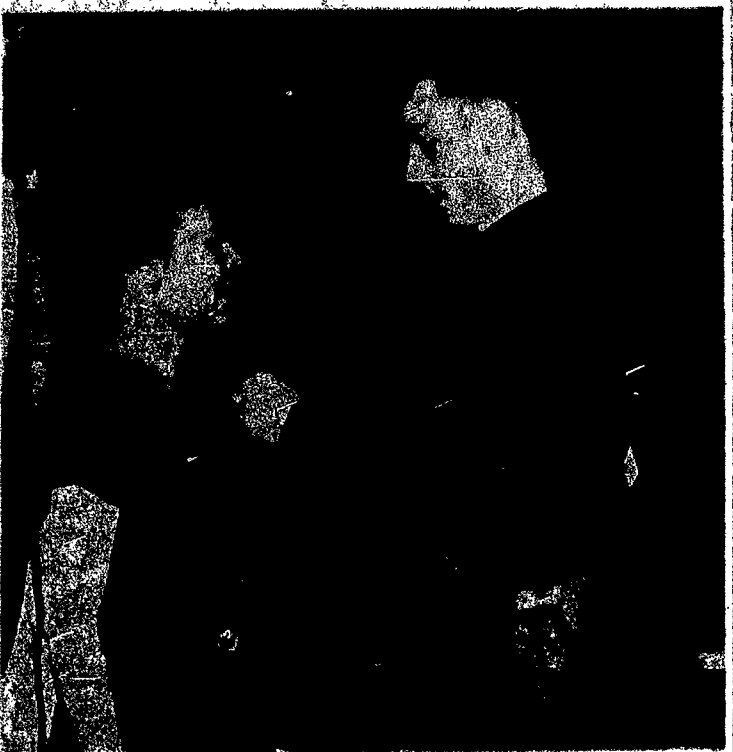
