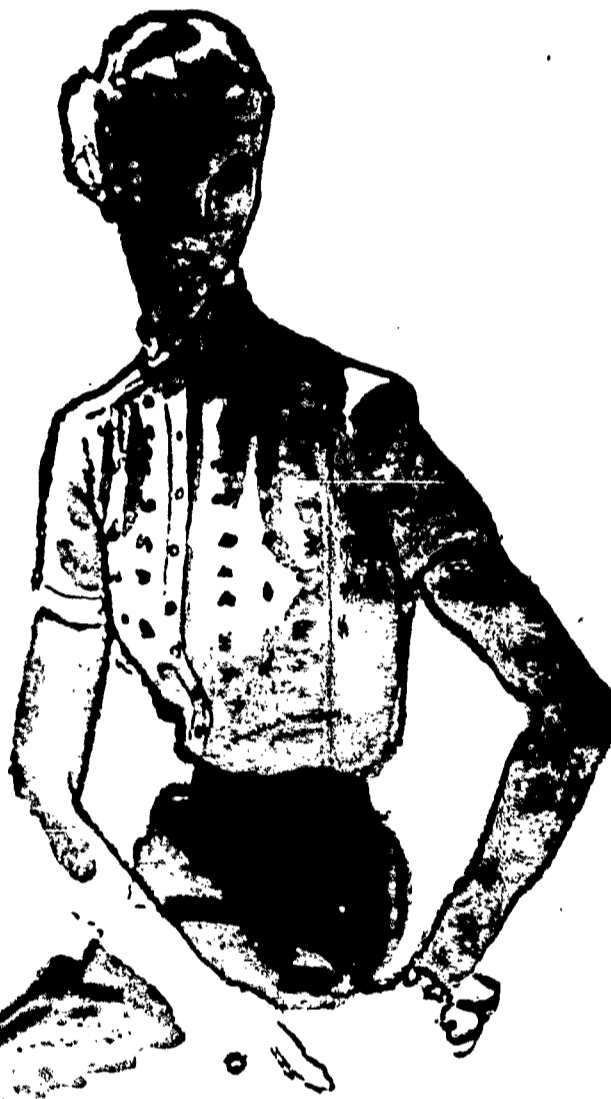

### Bishop Wright Scores Flood of 'Chain Letters'

Worcester, Mass. — (RNS) — Roman Catholic Bishop John J. Wright of Worcester said here that "pseudo-religious chain letters" circulating in this area are "sheer superstition."  
"Far from being pious," said, "they are actually pervasions of religion. They invariably originate with frauds, practical jokesters or unbalanced persons."

THE BISHOP made his comments during a Lenten service in St. Paul's Cathedral. He said that a "flood" of chain letters has entered this area from various parts of the United States, Europe and Australia.

Most of the letters ask the recipient to copy them and mail them to nine other persons within a specified time. The letters ask prayers for world peace or some spiritual grace, and frequently add that failure to keep up the "chain" will cause "bad luck."

"Chain letters which link prayer and its efficacy to the number of letters sent, or to other magical factors, are sheer superstition," Bishop Wright said.

THERE IS no room for doubt concerning the position of the Roman Catholic Church on chain letters.

"No one who understands either the nature of prayer or its exalted place in the spiritual life of a Christian, will give any credence whatsoever to the claims made by persons who send chain letters, however well-intended they may be."

"The world greatly needs prayers and all Christians instinctively ask the prayers of devout people. But no sensible person will pay any attention to chain letters. They should be promptly thrown in the nearest wastebasket."

### Monthly Mission Intentions Of Pope Pius Listed

Rome — (NC) — Concern over unsettled conditions in a war-threatened world and deep interest in the Orient are reflected in the monthly general and mission intentions of His Holiness Pope Pius XII for 1951.

The Pope's general intentions call for an "end to the spirit of hate," "mutual confidence among nations" and the "extirpation of lies." His mission intentions are concerned mainly with fostering Christianity in the Orient. Both the general and mission intentions for 1951 have been published here. They are:

March: General and special intentions of the Holy Father. Catholic education in Japan.

April: The seminaries of the priesthood. The strengthening of the faith of Christians in China.

May: For those who suffer persecution for the sake of justice. Christianity in Indonesia.

June: For a more perfect understanding of the strength of the adoration of the most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary to resist the catastrophes of this time.

For a solid Christian training of teachers in the missions.

July: For a wider activity of Catholic Action through the increased spiritual zeal of its members.

For good Christian instructions for the faithful in India.

August: For the end of the spirit of hate in the world through Christian charity. For the missionary work of women.

September: For a better understanding and love of the liturgy. For a Christian and social education in missionary countries.

October: For the right preaching of the word of God and its acceptance in a spirit of faith. For the Church in Oceania.

November: For mutual confidence among nations through the extirpation of lies.

For the missions in Indo-China.

December: For the penetration of the supernatural into the education of youth.

For the missions in the Arctic regions.

### Warsaw Suppresses Army Chaplains

London — (NC) — The communist regime in Poland is systematically suppressing all spiritual ministry in the armed forces despite an implied promise that the Church would have the right to provide chaplains for Catholics in the services. It has been learned here.

The Warsaw action in eliminating religious work in the armed forces is reportedly being taken at the direct instruction of the Kremlin.

Protestant and Jewish chaplains were removed from the armed forces some time ago, it was stated. The Red authorities simply "forgot" to appoint new chaplains to replace those removed. The Polish army is under the direction of Soviet Marshal Konstantin Rokossovski, who is serving as Minister of National Defense in the Polish cabinet.
