

### 2 Hornell Parishes Join In Holy Year Pilgrimage

### Laywomen Group To Aid Missionaries In Indo-China

Paris - (INS) - A group of young women belonging to the Lay Mission Auxiliaries, an international organization approved by the Vatican, will leave here shortly for Indo-China to help overworked priests and missionaries in war-stricken areas.

ALTHOUGH THEY will remain outside the religious orders, the women have undergone religious training for the mission calling. All have promised to devote their lives to the lay apostolate and to remain unmarried.

Mission auxiliaries serve as doctors, nurses or midwives, welfare officers, teachers or youth movement leaders. They are formed into teams of three members, each with different qualifications. In every case they are sent out in response to a request from the bishops under whose jurisdiction they will serve.

### Foundress Rites In Rome Hailed At Cenacle Here

Religious of the Cenacle who conduct the Cenacle Retreat House for women on East Ave., Rochester, will join with other members of their order throughout the world in rejoicing at the announcement received recently from Rome that Marie Victoire Theresia Couderc, foundress of the order will be beatified June 17.

Mother Theresa Couderc was born in the Ardeche Mountains at La Masse in southern France in 1805. Collaborating with Father Stephen Terme, she inaugurated the first retreat house for women at La Louvesc in 1826. From this first small house near the Shrine of St. Francis Regis, Cenacle Retreat Houses spread throughout Europe, coming to America in 1892. The first Cenacle in this country was located in New York City and is still functioning. From this nucleus new Cenacles spread throughout the United States and into Canada where they are located in Newport, Boston, Chicago, Ronkonkoma, St. Louis, Warrenville, Millwaukee, Middleton, Toronto, Vancouver, Rochester, Minneapolis, New Brunswick and South Chicago.

### Urges Portions Of Mass Be Said In Mother-Tongue

London - (NC) - The popular parts of the Mass, the personal parts of the administration of the Sacraments and all prayers at non-liturgical devotions should be said in the mother-tongue, according to the Editor of the Catholic Herald, British Catholic newspaper.

The Editor, summing up a correspondence on the Liturgy in English, writes: "I BELIEVE that a very great imaginative effort must be made to try to put ourselves into the position of those (the vast majority) to whom Latin is Chinese - and indeed of the Chinese and other faithful of the distant parts of the earth to whom Latin is, well, Latin.

"Why should we recite or even sing the Creed in Latin before a meeting or demonstration, especially when non-Catholics are likely to be present?" he asks. "The fact is that the vast majority of Catholics today do not understand Latin. Supposing such prayers and hymns were said or sung in Chinese? Even though you had always heard them in Chinese and had somewhere at home a translation of them into English, would you feel happy at the idea of Chinese always being used? Well, Latin is Chinese to millions of Catholics.

"HOW MANY WHO go to Confession understand as they hear the words of the Absolution and the words of the Eucharist?"
