

The courses are an extension of the work of the Saint Clare School of Education, organized by the college in 1920 to provide professional education for Sisters teaching in parochial elementary schools. Special education in this field has been offered chiefly during summer sessions.

THE PROGRAM to educate lay teachers for elementary schools has been set up by the college to help fill the pressing need for teachers in this field.

The elementary teachers educa. tion program for lay students will be a four year course at the college, with professional education courses concentrated in the junior year and a minimum of 180 hours of observation and practice teaching planned for the senior year.

The four-year program will meet education requirements throughout the country, as more states each year require four elmentary teachers.


