Religious Care For Draftees Stressed

Washington, D. C. (RNS)—Congressional concern for the religious and spiritual welfare of 18-year-old draftees will be expressed in specific language if Congress adopts the views of the Senate Armed Services Committee.

The Committee has incorporated in the first section of the universal military service and training bill the following language:

"Congress declares it to be in the national interest that personnel serving in the armed forces be protected and encouraged in the realization and development of those moral, spiritual, and religious values, consistent with the religious beliefs and convictions of the individuals concerned, which are fundamental in the preservation and strengthening of the fiber of American citizenship.

"In the pursuit of this end, the Congress further declares that it shall be the duty of every commanding officer in every echelon of command in the respective services of the armed forces to maintain to the highest possible degree within his command those conditions and influences calculated to protect the health, morals, and spiritual welfare of the personnel of his command."
