New York — (NC) — Plans for a national pilgrimage to Rome for the beatification of Madame Couderc, on June 17 of the Venerable Theresia Couderc, have been announced by the Society of Our Lady of the Retreat in the Cenacle, of which Mother Couderc was the foundress.

The 28-day pilgrimage will leave New York on May 31, visiting Rome, Assisi, Paris and Lourdes, near the shrine of St. Regis, where Mother Couderc founded her first retreat house for women in 1826. The pilgrimage will return to New York on June 27.

Once this column, apropos of sex instruction, wrote, "Tell them all and tell them early."

IT IS NOT easy to approach the subject, particularly for the first time. Once started, though, it is not so difficult as it might seem in anticipation. It is easier if it can be introduced naturally as when a baby is expected in the family or when a neighbor child announces a new brother or sister on the way.

Most of us have found that it can be done more naturally while both parent and child are engaged in some mutually shared task. For example, or cleaning a room, or mending a broken chair. An awkward pause can be filled in with a comment about the work at hand and the subject ends without the abrupt "Now this is your lesson for the day" attitude.
