### Austrian Hierarchy Asks for Boycott of Harmful Movies

Vienna — (RNS) — A joint pastoral letter issued by the Austrian Catholic hierarchy called for a boycott of all foreign and domestic films that are "irreconcilable with Christian morals" and "exercise an evil influence on youth."

Signed by Theodor Cardinal Innitzer, Archbishop of Vienna, and the other Austrian bishops, the letter was ordered read in all Catholic churches on Sunday, Apr. 8.

### Lisbon Prepares Film on Fatima

Lisbon — (RNS) — Work has begun on a Portuguese film based on the famed apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima at Covadaria in 1917.

Scenario of the film, which is to be photographed at the actual site of the apparitions, has been approved by the Most Rev. Jose Corrao de Silva, Bishop of Leiria, in whose diocese Covadaria is located.

The bishop also has approved the cast for the film and named the Rev. Dr. Jose Galamba de Oliveira as adviser to the producer.

Aura Abranches, one of Portugal's leading actresses, will play the part of Maria Rosa, mother of Lucia, the only survivor of the three shepherd children who witnessed the apparitions.
