Canned Casserole O'Tuna

Unique Vocation Program Slated

London — (NC) — A meeting of nuns from eight congregations and 185 women between the ages of 17 and 30 — believed to be the first of its kind in Britain — took place in St. Joseph's parish, Sunderland, County Durham, to give the girls first-hand information about the religious life and so promote vocations.

Nuns and girls were divided into groups of 20 to allow questions and close discussion. Girls from outside districts were boarded with parishioners.

QUESTIONS WERE prepared for general discussion and films were shown of various congregations, especially missionary sisters at work. Subjects discussed included:

Do our Catholic girls lack generosity and zeal, or do they lack encouragement from priests, parents and the religious orders themselves? Are the rules of congregations in keeping with the immense changes in upbringing and outlook of our Catholic girls?

Has the modern girl been the cause of the fall in vocations, for example through the only child being unwilling to leave its parents? DOES THE GIRL in a big family fall more easily into the way of community life? What does the modern girl, with her striving for independence, think about obedience to rule, to superiors, etc? Is nuns' dress impractical and is it an embarrassment to the modern girl?

AMONG WOMEN Home-School Projects

National Council of Catholic Women in its 1950 convention unanimously approved a resolution urging that every parish have a Home and School Association, known in many places as a Parent-Teacher Association. It is obvious that the need for close cooperation between parents and the school exists, but for reasons deemed prudent, many Catholic schools are without such an organization.

In many instances the teachers have opposed the formation of a Home and School Association because of the fear that parents might try to interfere with the administration of the school. For example, by trying to interfere with disciplinary procedures, by attempting to cut down on the amount of home work or by criticizing teaching methods.

WE ALL know that there is some validity to these apprehensions because anyone connected with school work has some time or another encountered a parent (generally, I regret to say it is a mother) who thinks she would make a better principal than the person holding that office.

It seems to me that good will on both sides can often suppress such tendencies before too much damage has been done. Tactful handling can often channel the critic's energies into constructive work.

The National Chairman of the Committee of Catholic Home and School Associations, N.C.C.W., summed up this side of the question when she wrote:

"Experience has proven that such excessive zeal is inevitable, but this need not mean that the whole idea of Home and School Associations be discarded because of quite legitimate fears about abuses. Rather the idea is to correct the abuses and to develop Home and School projects and programs that are mutually agreeable to parents and teachers."
