### 'Abendpost' To Issue 100th Anniversary Edition Today

To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 'Abendpost', Rochester's German Daily Newspaper, a special edition is being brought out today at the papers' plant.

The edition will carry a letter from His Excellency, Bishop Kearney and a history of the first German Catholic Churches in Rochester compiled by Leo Saeum, prominent in the Catholic Keeping Society.

A complete history of the important German Societies of the city will be included, as well as stories and pictures of many German cities. Articles will cover George Eastman, Jacob J. Bausch, Capt. Henry Lomb, Carl Schurz, Baron von Steuben, Pastorius, Washington, Lincoln, Memorial Art Gallery, Eastman Theater and Ward's Museum.

THE PRESENT paper published at the Andrews Street address traces back to the first German newspaper in Rochester, "Beobachter am Genesee," founded in 1851.

In an editorial in the Centenary edition, the 'Abendpost' will say: "American citizens of German birth and extraction are proud of the part they and their ancestors have played in the development of our City, State and Nation. They point with pride to the year 1851, when their forebears established the first German language paper in Rochester, the parent of the 'Abendpost,' which for decades has done much to develop the business, social and cultural life of our community."
