Music will be provided by Patty O'Hara Band.

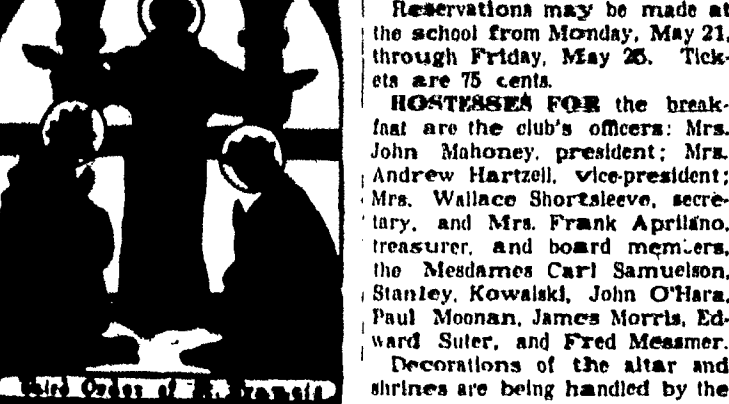
