

The only English speaking member of the Congregation, Father Patrick Maloney, was sent at once. He landed in New York, Sept. 4, 1850. Two years later the first Banillan school in America, Rf. Michael's collage was opened under Father Jean Soulerin, 116 had 54 pupils under him that first years 31 of them later became priest. Before he was called back to France in 1965, in become Sup-erfor General, he had solidly founded his Congregation in America on native vocations.

In 1922 the Holy See separ-ated the two provinces into distinct Congregations; the Congregation of Priests of St. Baall of Toronto, and the Congregation of Priests of St. Basil of the Diocese of Viviers. In America as in France the

Congregation settled in the smaller centers of population. Consequently its growth slow, no more than enough to staff existing schools and par-



ations at rather long intervals. But during the last 30 years the cities in which it located have expanded enormously, and with their growth has come a corresponding one in the Congregation.- Today it numbers 248 priests, 145 scho-lastics and 43 novices.



Trained Teachers

Members are carefully prepared for their life of teaching All have academic degrees and teachers' certificates; nearly all have had the benefit of some postgraduate training, and more than half the priests hold advanced degrees from the leading universities of America and Europe. From this last comes a freshness of outlook to balance any conservatism acquired in Basilian schools. The majority of Basilian vocations come from their own high schools and colleges.

Aguinas institute

At the request of Archbishop (now Cardinal) Mooney, the Basilians took over the Aquinas institute of Rochester in 1937 The enrollment increased yearly to the extent that another unit was formed, the Aquinas Annex which houses the freshman class.

Aquinas has both a precollege course and a general course. Every graduate leaves Aquinas with a Regents diploma and is prepared to pursue further studies at some college or university. Approximately 20 scholarships are obtained each year to various colleges and universities.


Many clubs and co-curricular activities are sponsored by the school, and all students are encouraged to participate in these activities.
