

Historic Scene as Cardinal Spellman Opened St. John Fisher Drive



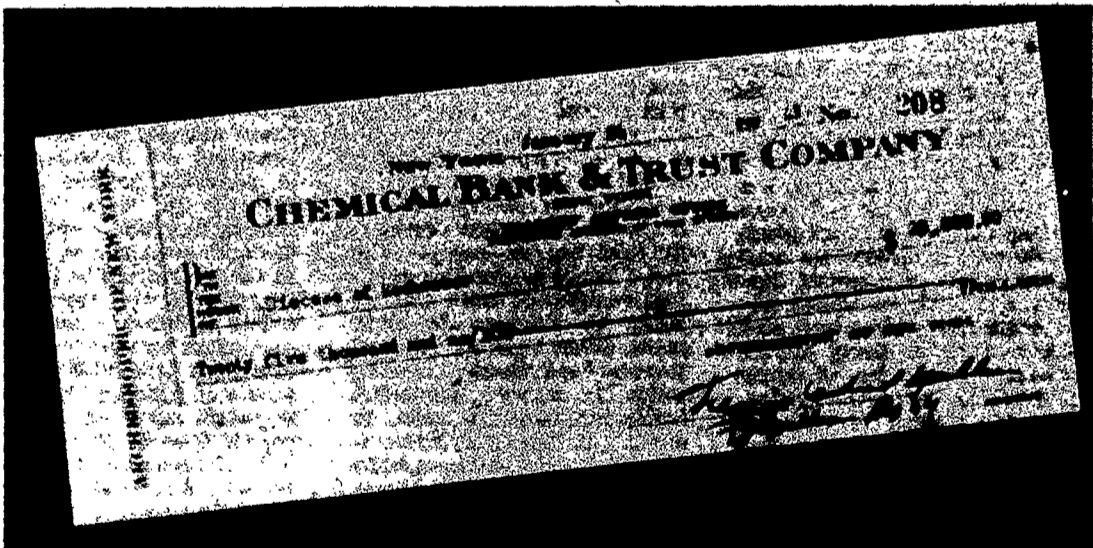

Only One Catholic Reported In Tibet

Bombay, India — (NC) — There is only one known Catholic in all of Tibet, according to a report carried in The Examiner, archdiocesan weekly here.

Tibet, the land of the lamas situated northeast of India, is a strictly lamaist-Buddhist country, and has several times expelled Catholic missionaries who tried to preach the Faith there.

The single Tibetan Catholic cannot be identified, the paper said for reasons of his personal security. It added that he was converted by a Swiss priest in a neighboring country.

Tibet, which has for many years acted as an independent country but is claimed by Red China, has an estimated population of one million people.

Papal Nuncio To Ireland Dies

Dublin — (RNS) — Archbishop Ettore Falot, Italian-born Papal Nuncio to Ireland, died here at the age of 79 after undergoing an operation. He was appointed to the Dublin post in 1948 in place of the late Archbishop Pascual Robinoza, O.F.M.
