

### Bishop Cassidy, Fall River Prelate, Dies

Fall River, Mass. — (UPI) — Bishop Thomas J. Cassidy, 68, of Fall River, died at 10:30 a. m. today in the St. Joseph hospital here. He had been ill for several days.

The late Bishop Cassidy, who served in the diocese of Fall River from 1923 to 1948, was a prominent figure in the Roman Catholic Church. He was known for his work in social justice and his efforts to improve the lives of the poor in his diocese.

He was born in Fall River, Mass., on May 17, 1883. He was ordained a priest in 1906 and served in various parishes before being named bishop of Fall River in 1923. He was a member of the National Council of Catholic Bishops and the American Bishops' Conference.

His death was a great loss to the diocese. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Cassidy, and several children.

Waterbury, Conn. — (RNS) — The Board of Education voted here to permit a Roman Catholic parochial school to share one of the city's grammar school buildings for the rest of the school term. It also voted to supply textbooks and any other materials needed by the parochial students and their teachers, who are nuns.

This action was taken at a special board meeting called by Mayor Raymond E. Snyder following a fire that caused \$20,000 damage to St. Thomas' parochial school.

Under the board's decision the public school students will attend classes in the morning. In the afternoon the parochial school pupils will take over the building under the supervision of the nuns.

### Protests Gideon Bibles in School

Menasha, Wis. — (RNS) — Protests against the distribution of Gideon Bibles to Menasha high school pupils were made by local Roman Catholic priests. The protests stressed that the Bible version handed out by the Gideons is not approved by the Catholic Church.

More than 300 Bibles were passed out at the school, according to Peter Bylow, a member of the Gideons. He said that a large number of pupils had refused to accept them. Permission to distribute the Bibles was granted by the school board.

### State Department Raps Red Tactic

Washington, D. C. — Communist exploitation of White Sunday in Germany and Austria, is exposed and denounced by the State Department in a new publication "Confuse and Control" which documents Communist efforts to corrupt the youth of Germany.

The book charges that the choice of White Sunday by Communists for youth demonstrations and other propaganda events is the result of an intentional plan to corrupt Christian holidays and festivals.

Zablocki of Wisconsin.

### Labor Head Hits Bigotry, Discrimination In Bus Issue

La Crosse, Wis. — (UPI) — Discrimination and bigotry regarding bus transportation of children attending parochial schools was strongly denounced here by George Haberman, Wisconsin State president of the American Federation of Labor.

Speaking at a recent gathering to honor George Hall upon his appointment as secretary-treasurer of the Wisconsin Federation of Labor, Mr. Haberman, a non-Catholic, condemned class legislation and group discrimination in the Gettelman bill at Madison which would provide parochial school children transportation on public buses provided parents paid for such transportation.

The educational and legislative program of the American labor movement "is not one of class legislation," Mr. Haberman declared. "For whom we decide upon or embark upon a program of educational legislation, consideration is given to all the citizens of our state."

In Rotary Procession Liverpool, England — (UPI) — Men broke from the crowds of cheering onlookers to join 12,000 members of the Catholic Young Men's Society who marched, reciting the Rosary and singing hymns, through the main streets of Liverpool.
