Corning Girl Wins First Prize In Spelling Test

Corning — Joan Hiney, of the Fifth Grade, St. Patrick's School, was grand prize winner in the second annual spelling contest sponsored by the Corning Evening Leader. She was the winner last year also.

Among the six last contestants in the spell-down were four pupils from St. Patrick's and one each from Painted Post and Northside public schools. For the final elimination it was necessary to choose words outside of the New York State syllabus.

Other winners in the contest which 33 contestants representing five school districts participated were sixth grade, Grace Latashaw of Northside elementary school; fifth grade, Patricia McCarthy of the Painted Post Schools; and fourth grade, Donald Kreamer of the Northside elementary school.

AN AUDIENCE of 300 persons in Corning Free Academy auditorium heard the contestants. The grand prize winner was presented with a radio set by George H. Bevan, managing editor of the Leader.

Carl K. Griffing, elementary school principal in District 13, who was general chairman of the contest, said that it was more difficult to "spell down" the contestants this year than in the contest last year, despite the fact that the entire word list was used up last year, and a new word list had to be prepared.

"We used a longer list this year," he said. "I think it was longer than both the regular and supplementary lists last year. But the judges still had to add words before the final champion was determined."

"It is notable that there were fourth grade pupils still competing up to the last 10 contestants. The last few contestants were outstanding. They spelled words which many an educated adult might stumble over."

The three-hour session started at 6:30 p.m. with an informal "warm-up period." The formal spelling session was under way at 7:45 and it was almost 9:30 before the grand prize winner was determined.

Mr. Griffing opened the program and explained the rules. The words were read by Mrs. William C. Droegge, and names of contestants were announced by Ronald Graham.

Judges were Leon Robbins, Mrs. William Levitt, and Miss Patricia Griffin. Serving on the committee on arrangements were Mr. Griffing, who represented the Northside elementary school; James McCollough, District 9 elementary schools supervisor, representing those schools; the Rev. Earl Tobin, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, representing the parochial schools; Edwin Draper, elementary school principal at Painted Post, representing that school; and Calvin U. Smith of Painted Post, superintendent of Supervisory District Number One, who represented the rural schools in this area.

Among the honored guests was the Hon. Michael Walsh, K.S.C., Supreme Court Justice, State of New York of Brooklyn, and a past state deputy of the Knights of Columbus.
