Newark Student Chosen 'Girl Sodalist Of June' By National Sodality Magazine

Newark — The nationally circulated *Queen's Work* magazine for Teen-age Sodalists has chosen 17 year old Miss Anita Gullio of St. Michael's parish, Newark, as Girl Sodalist of June.

This monthly feature of the magazine selects one boy and one girl as a nationwide, outstanding member of the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin.

Miss Gullio, a senior at Newark High School, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Gullio, 616 Church St. She was recently cited in the *Courier-Journal* as a scholarship winner to Nazareth College.

As Prefect, Miss Gullio headed a parish Sodality group composed of High School girls, all of whom attend a public High School. As yet, Newark does not have either a Catholic grade nor high school. The aim of St. Michael's Sodality has been to provide the spiritual activity and opportunity necessarily lacking in secular schools.

During the past year, Anita has arranged for the Sodality — a retreat at the Convent, an afternoon of Reflection conducted by Rev. John T. Callahan, a Reception Ceremony with Rev. Joseph O'Connell as guest speaker.

Another Rochester Catholic has been reported killed in action in Korea. He is Cpl. Joseph McCabe, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. McCabe, 5 Donlon St. According to the telegram received by his parents, Cpl. McCabe was killed April 25, 1951.

Mrs. McCabe received a letter from her youngest son, written on Apr. 14 from a rest camp. He said that the company had marched 10 miles to the rear area camp, where the infantrymen were able to bathe and were served hot food. Previously Corporal McCabe said that his unit was near the Inje River and had participated in an operation with paratroopers.

The soldier who was with the third division was graduated from Blessed Sacrament School and Monroe High School. He was about to enter the Rochester Institute of Technology when he enlisted in the Army in July 1948. Sent overseas in November of 1950 he went to Korea last March.

Corporal McCabe has three brothers, Vincent, 26; Matthew, 20; and Charles, 23, all of Rochester; five sisters, Mrs. Grace Chapman, Baltimore, Md.; Rose Ann Wright and Veronica, Francis and Marlene McCabe, of Rochester.
