Graduates Are Told

St. Bonaventure University's four hundred forty-three graduates were warned Sunday, June 3, that they "face a world which is threatened by conditions and events which make it very difficult to work out our own destiny."

The 1st Commencement speaker, Peter Campbell Brown, member of the Subversive Activities Control Board in Washington, D.C., told the graduates the present time is an impressive hour in the history of mankind because "it is so crucial."

Our heritage, that of American Democracy, is now challenged by the most ruthless forces which has ever arisen in the history of the world, he said.

The 36-year-old Brooklyn-born lawyer told the graduates they "must become a source of the leadership which free people will require to meet the challenge of the totalitarian dictators. We must mobilize our spiritual and moral forces so that this heritage can be preserved and maintained, not only for ourselves but for those who will follow us."

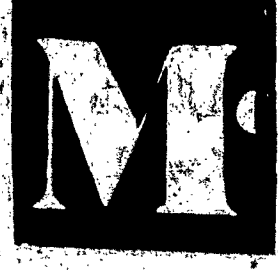
