

the Reds last September have been removed from a well alongside the Franciscan monastery here, all apparently Koreans, according to examinations made locally.

The American Graves Registration Services cooperated with the Korean workers in the re-

Workers have reached the bottom of the well. It has been definitely established that there are no more bodies below. It took three days to remove the debris above the water level.

Contrary to newspaper reports, no bodies were found in the well prior to this week's work. The findings thus fall to con-
