Bishop, College Head Address 270 Niagara Grads

Niagara, N. Y.—Bishop Joseph Lennon Federal, Auxiliary of St. Luke, the Very Rev. John A. Flynn, C.S.M., president of St. John's University, Brooklyn, and William J. Bernal, superintendent of Niagara Falls public schools, received honorary degrees at Niagara University's 54th annual commencement exercises.

The program began with a Benediction Mass offered in the student center by the Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., university president.

IN HIS REMARKS, Bishop Federal said: "While there is always the possibility that you may be called upon by your country to take up the sword in defense of her rights, nevertheless, your greater service to the Church, to all civilization, will be your personal piety and sanctity."

In the commencement address, Father Flynn declared: "The function of a Catholic educator is to clearly and not to mystify. He has a clear duty to motivate his students to face realities and not to retreat to a vacuum. He must inspire them to grasp the whole truth courageously and not to seek the insecure shelter of whitewash cliches. He has the obligation of exemplifying decisive conscientious activity, and of warning in the easy luxury of compromise in the chery manipulation of disgusting politics."

Bust of Boy Beatus Given To St. Patrick's Parish

A bust of Blessed Dominic Savio was presented to St. Patrick's Parish by members of the Mother's Club on Sunday, June 10. Blessed Dominic, one of Don Bosco's boys, died at the age of 14 in 1857 and was beatified by Pope Pius XII on March 5, 1900.

Blessed Dominic is known as God's Teenager because he was a "Little Giant of Sanctity" as Pope Pius XI called him. The mothers of the Club express the hope that the presence of the bust of Blessed Dominic, in the classroom or the recreation hall, will be a powerful challenge to their own teenager sons and daughters.

IN THE SUNDAY instruction, it was suggested: "If any mother or father is having difficulty with a teenager son or daughter, let a picture of Blessed Dominic Savio be put up in the home and a prayer offered daily that the new Beatus will be a kind of 'big brother' or 'spiritual companion' to that boy or girl."

After the Sunday Masses, the altar boys distributed pictures, prayers and stories of Blessed Dominic to those who were interested. The guiding rule of Dominic's life was the one he made on his first Holy Communion day: "I will prefer death rather than sin." One day later, he told his Confessor, Don Bosco: "What I would like best of all is that you make a saint of me. I want to give myself to God forever; if I don't become a saint I feel that I shall have done nothing worth while. I believe God wants me to be a saint, and I want to work with Him towards that end."

Just about a month before Blessed Pius X died, he said of this boy: "I honestly believe that Dominic Savio is the best Model for the Youth of our times. A teenager, such as he, who bravely struggled to preserve his baptismal innocence to the very last and who, moreover, showed no signs of real defects during his short span of life, is indeed a saint!"
