

Miss Lacey Paid Tribute On 25 Years As Teacher

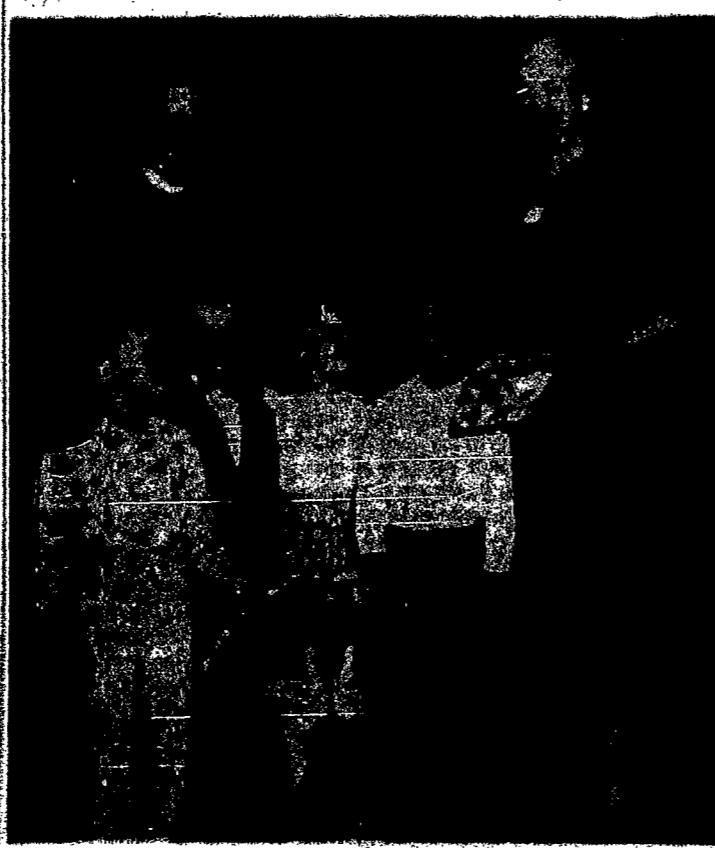

Brockport Educator Hits Evils In 'Comic Books'

Brockport — Popularity of "comic books" among both youth and the adults of the nation was stressed as cause for concern by Dr. Clarence Styza, Brockport State Teachers College instructor, in a talk given at the annual Father and Son Communion Breakfast of the Holy Name Society of the Church of the Nativity, R.V.M., at Bolger Hall, Brockport, Sunday morning.

Dr. Styza showed various types of the booklets and told of reasons for objections to some and educational benefits of others. He mentioned current surveys underway by the State of New York and other governmental agencies to determine future legislation on the publications. HE SUGGESTED that the Holy Name Society and similar organizations initiate lending libraries of the desirable books in an attempt to discourage the circulation among school children of the type of literature injurious to moral character. The speaker brought out the statistic that comic books out-sell by a ten to one ratio such national magazines as The Saturday Evening Post, Life and Readers Digest. The reason for
