Trabold, O.F.M., son of Mr. and Mrs. Norbert Trabold of 43 Ivy Street, Rochester, will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood in the Order of Friars Minor, at the Franciscan Monastery, Washington, D.C., on Friday, June 29, by the Most Rev. Anselmo Giovanni Cioconetti, D.D., Apostolic Delegate to the United States.

Father Trabold will celebrate his first solemn Mass in Saint Boniface Church, Sunday, July 1st, at eleven o'clock. Rev. Dr. Walter J. Kohl will be arch priest; Rev. Charles Adams, O.F.M., deacon and Rev. Conrad Schonecke, O.F.M., sub deacon.

THE CEREMONY will be presided over by Rev. Arnold Brown, O.F.M. Reception will be held Sunday afternoon, July 1, from 2:30 to 5:30 p.m., at the Parish Hall, on Watkins Street.

Father Trabold is a graduate of St. Boniface School and Aquinas Institute. After two years of preparatory study at St. Joseph's Seminary, Callicoon, N. Y., he entered the Franciscan Novitiate at Paterson, N. J. He attended the Franciscan Houses of Philosophy at Croghan, N. Y., and Butler, N. J., and received his theological training at Holy Name College, Washington, D. C. He did post graduate work at St. Bonaventure University, Cazenovia.

Mass For PFC Armour Yahn Reported Killed In Korea

A Memorial Mass for PFC Armour Yahn, 24, son of Edwin R. Yahn, Mailing Room foreman of the Catholic Courier Journal and Mrs. Yahn, was offered by the Rev. Thomas C. Tallaride, C.S.C. in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Wednesday.

Private Yahn who was reported missing in Korea since Feb. 12 was killed in action, the Defense Department notified his wife, Mrs. Ruth Yahn of 108 Scrantom St. on June 14.

His parents, of 1026 Joseph Ave. received a message from their son's chaplain, a week ago, telling that the soldier was lost during a mission to break up an enemy roadblock in the Searal area.

Chinese Reds attacked in force at that time, the message revealed and Privats Yahn and his group apparently were trapped. Whether they were taken north and what happened to them has not been revealed.

The young man first entered the Army in 1945 and served with the occupational troops in Germany. He was discharged after 18 months only to be recalled as a Reservist in November 1950. He was sent to Korea last Christmas Eve. Private Yahn was a Star Scout with Troop 48 and a graduate of Benjamin Franklin High School. He started his school career at St. Stanislaus School.

Grandson of an officer who served in the Russian Czar's army, he was one of the few soldiers of Russian descent fighting against Communism.

Before returning to the service he was employed at Rochester Products.
