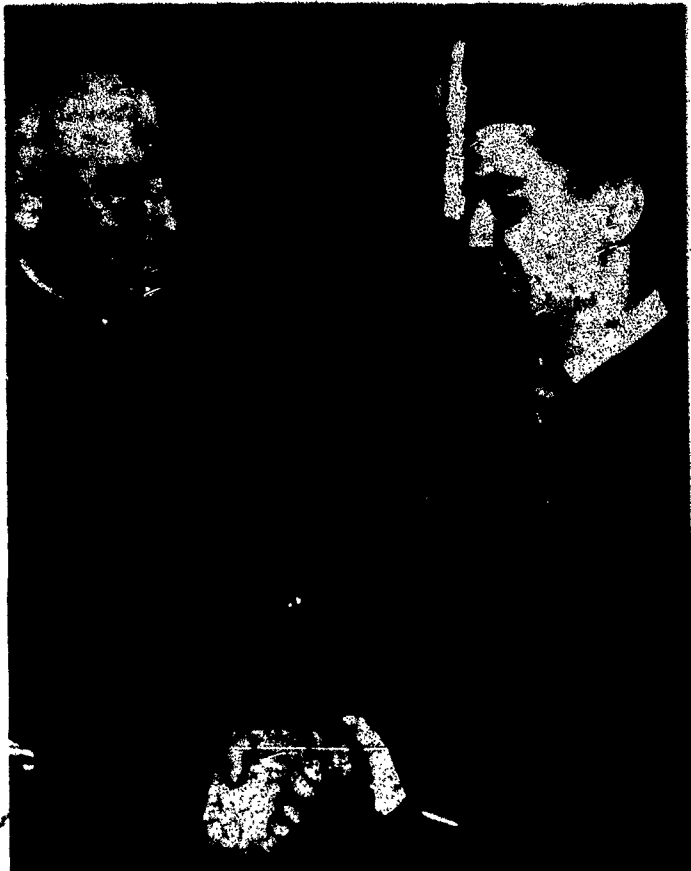


# Four Rochester Catholic High Schools List 851 Graduates

## Auburn Parish Marks Jubilee

Auburn — Parishioners attending the Golden Jubilee Mass celebrated last Sunday at St. Aloysius in observance of the parish's half-century of life, heard His Excellency Bishop Kearney stress the Church's role of bringing God to men and men to God. He urged listeners to spread the Gospel of Christ with greater faith and love in their own parish as an act of atonement for the sacrifices now being committed behind the Iron Curtain.

With Bishop Kearney presiding, the Rev. John E. Crowley, pastor of St. Aloysius, celebrated the Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the parish by the late Rev. John J. McGrath.

**BISHOP KEARNEY**, in his sermon, said it was more than a happy coincidence that the jubilee celebration came on a day so close to the feast of St. Aloysius (June 21) the patron of the parish. Noting that the history of the parish is featured in the current issue of the Catholic Courier-Journal, he called attention to the fact that the history of a parish is not a matter of dates and facts, of individual priests and people. In the final analysis, he said, the record of a parish is a spiritual one. The great realities can not be written in any history, for the "great realities" to be known in their complete detail only before the Judgement Seat of God.

Bishop Kearney explained that the purpose of Christ, in establishing His Church, was a twofold one: to bring God to men and to bring men to God. The Bishop pointed out that such is the theme of the story of a parish, and showed how the institution of the Blessed Sacrament and the sacrifice of the Mass served to bring God to men.
