Cigaret Carries 'Mary's Light' To Red Germany

Berlin — (NC) — A burning cigarette carried the "Light of Our Lady" into the Soviet zone of Germany under the noses of Communist policemen, it was learned this week.

This was the second time in a year that German Catholic youths, celebrating Mary's month of May, have outwitted watchful Red officials.

More than 700,000 young Catholics throughout six countries in Europe took part this year in the celebration, which began in Altenberg Cathedral, near Cologne.

There, at midnight May 1, fire was blessed in honor of Our Lady at the foot of her statue. Relay runners then lighted their candles at the flame, and set forth.

THE FANNED throughout Western Germany and handed on the flames to other runners in Holland, Belgium, France, Switzerland and Austria. Two set out for the Soviet zone of Germany.

These two unarmed young men transferred the flame to miners' lamps, mounted motorcycles, and crossed the Soviet zone border at Helmstedt.
