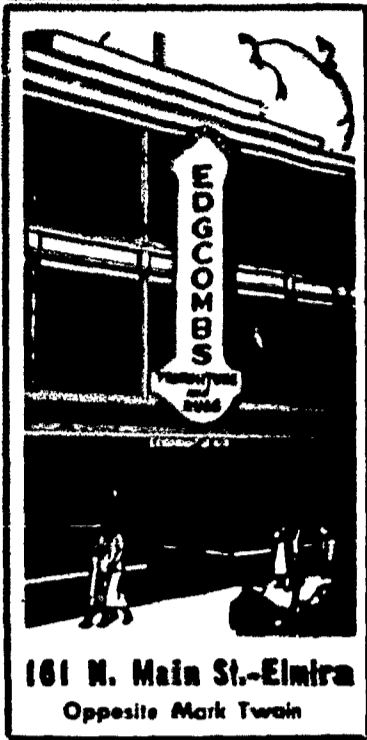

Father Naughton Urges L. of C. To Be Lay Apostles

GUEST SPEAKER was the Rev. William J. Naughton, former Moderator, Father Naughton, pastor of St. Anne's Church, Rochester, stressed the fact that the members should be on guard against encroaching enemies of our freedom, religion and democracy and urged the continuance of charity in thought as well as actions towards our fellow men.

Referring to the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on which occasion, the Sisters of St. Joseph renewed vows, Father Naughton pointed out the importance of the Ladies of Charity considering themselves as Lay Apostles to carry on the work of Christ just as the Sisters do throughout their lives.

Father Bisky presented Mrs. John McCormack, retiring president with the book, "All Day with God" by Blanche Jennings Thompson, as a mark of appreciation for her untiring efforts as leader of the group for six years.
