

Derry Hails De Valera on First Visit in 25 Years

Dublin — (NC) — For the first time in more than 25 years, Ireland's Prime Minister Eamon de Valera paid a visit to Derry, "city of St. Columba," and received a rousing

welcome from the people, but civic authorities of Northern Ireland took no notice of the distinguished visitor.

De Valera had come to Derry to attend the silver jubilee of the Ulster Committee for the Gaelic Revival. He stressed the importance of the Irish language as a powerful means of preserving the nation during the years of partition.

Senator Noel Farrow of Derry, who presided at a luncheon in honor of De Valera, said that in any other city of the world one holding such high office as the "Taoiseach" (Prime Minister) would be honored by the civic authorities who he paid a visit to their city, but today the people who had assumed the right to rule there were conspicuous

lon, and abhors all disputes which agitate nations and sometimes bring them to utter ruin."

The Encyclical continued with further laudation of the missionaries and their work, with indications of the lines along which the missionary effort should be further developed, with exhortations for its continued and extended support.

Without being directed against anyone, the letter served clear notice to Communists and to all others who would choke off the teaching mission of the Church, that the Church is playing for keeps; that the missionaries will "stick" for the cause of Christ. The Sacred Consistorial Congregation in Rome called the "trial" of Archbishop Groesz "iniquitous," and announced the excommunication of all who had a hand in it. Observatore Romano, the Vatican City newspaper, said the "trial" reminded one of a comic opera plot and would have been ridiculous if the charges against the prelate did not serve as the "shameless pretext for a new abuse of power."

Priest-Author Street-Preaching

Jacksonville, N. C. — (NC) — A noted priest writer, who turns to the apostolate of street preaching for his summer, already has attracted 30 converts in a course of instructions in Catholicism in a mission area of 24,000 which does not have one native adult Catholic.

The street preacher at Immaculate Conception mission here is the Rev. Dr. John A. O'Brien, University of Notre Dame professor and author of several best-sellers, who customarily spends his summer "vacations" bringing the word of God to the highways and byways. Through his writing and teaching, as well as his street preaching, Dr. O'Brien has attracted many converts to the Church.

Priest Writes Book About Life of Parish Assistant

Milwaukee — (NC) — "The wonder and the beauty and the loneliness and the bitterness of a young priest's life in Christ's vineyard" is the subject of a new novel, written by a young priest, the Rev. William L. Doty, and issued by the Bruce Publishing Company here. In "Fire in the Rain," Father Doty tells of a young parish assistant's struggle for renewed zeal which he feels he has lost in seven years of routine duties. Father Doty, a teacher at Cardinal Hayes High School, New York City, first thought of writing his book in the initial years after his ordination.

Jesuit To Be Bishop of Pacific Isles

Boston — (NC) — Bishop-designate Thomas J. Feeney, S.J., will be consecrated Vicar Apostolic of the Caroline and Marshall Islands here Sept. 8.

The Bishop-designate announced that Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston will be the consecrator and that one of the consecrators will be Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, Auxiliary of New York and auxiliary director of The Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Father Feeney has been superior of the Marshall Islands mission work since 1947. His vicariate is spread over 2,000,000 square miles of ocean. There are 18,000 Catholics among the 47,000 who populate the islands. As head of the vicariate, Bishop-designate Feeney will make his headquarters at Truk, which was a large Japanese naval base during World War II.

FATHER FEENEY is a native of Jamaica Plain, Mass. He is an alumnus of Boston College High School and Boston College. He was with the first detachment of U. S. Jesuits who went to the Philippines in 1921 and for a number of years was an official of the Jesuit Missions organization.

He is a brother of the Rev. William H. Feeney, S.J., who is stationed in Jamaica, British West Indies, and Sister Mary Ignatia of the Sisters of St. Joseph, stationed in Revere, Mass. He has another brother and two sisters.

Catholic's UN Essay Wins

Cairo, Egypt — (NC) — The Egyptian winner of the 1951 United Nations annual prize for the best essay on social and political problems is a Catholic journalist and a radio writer. He is Raymond Tagher, of the Melkite Rite, who wrote on "The United Nations and the Evolution of the Concept of International Solidarity." Tagher was awarded a free visit to the United States, where he will spend one month at the expense of the United Nations.

Japan Catholic Directory Shows Increase in Priests

Tokyo — (NC) — The new Catholic Directory of Japan gives the addresses of all parishes both in Roman and Japanese characters, and a brief historical sketch of all the dioceses, vicariates and prelati-

tures apostolic in the country. It also outlines the history of the 31 missionary societies of men and 57 communities of women now working here.

TWO NEW parishes were established in 1945, eight in 1946, four in 1947, 20 in 1948, 30 in 1949, 33 in 1950 and five during the first weeks of 1951. A total of 143 churches have been built or rebuilt since the war, including 19 still under construction.

The total of parishes listed in the new directory is 421 but of these 94 are out-missions without a resident pastor. The total number of Catholics in the nation last year was 142,460. This compared with 130,366 in 1949, 119,234 in 1948 and 109,283 in 1947. The number of priests has increased from 743 to 877 between July 1, 1950, and May 1, 1951.

OF SPECIAL interest are brief paragraphs concerning the 14 major and minor seminaries for the training of the diocesan and religious clergy. The directory gives data on six schools of college or university grade, 15 junior colleges, technical and vocational schools, 60 high and middle schools and 25 elementary schools.

A special section on social service institutions, orphanages, nursing homes and baby homes provides similar information concerning 92 institutions and describes 45 service hospitals, dispensaries and sanatoria. These do not include the Conferences of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, which now number more than 200. According to the directory, Japan has 34 Catholic newspapers, magazines and other periodicals.

The book is in English, has 330 pages and can be obtained from the National Catholic Committee, at 10, 6-Bancho, Chiyodaku, Tokyo.

House Resolution Protests Arrest Of Abp. Groesz

Washington — (NC) — A resolution protesting the "summary arrest and confinement of Archbishop Josef Groesz of Hungary" has been introduced in the House of Representatives by Representative Jacob K. Javits of New York.

Last year Javits, member of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, introduced a similar resolution in behalf of His Eminence Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty, and has been active to effect the release of the Cardinal from imprisonment.

Arrest and confinement of Archbishop Groesz, the resolution reads, "should be strongly protested by the United States in the United Nations as a violation of the Charter and as a further violation of the treaties of peace, and that such other action as may be deemed appropriate, shall be taken by the United States thereon."
