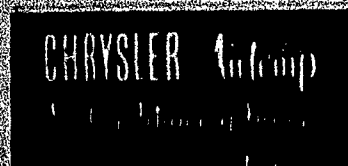


Rochester Health Officer Lauds Hornell Hospital

Hornell—Tribute to St. James Mercy Hospital, with its new wing, and to all who had a part in erecting the addition was paid at a dinner attended by 87 representatives of state, regional and local hospital boards and firms actively connected with the new wing's construction.



Principal commendation came from Dr. Albert D. Kaiser, Rochester city health officer, who declared that the hospital is as fine as any in the country.

Attorney Joseph W. Challen, Rochester, explained that the dinner was held "to extend thanks to those who have assisted in building the hospital."

"You can buy a home all built," the health officer said, "but to build a hospital somebody must have a dream. Many have to work to raise the necessary funds. Money raising is important, but above all, you must have the will to build a good hospital."

"THE SPIRIT of friendly cooperation so evident in Hornell will lead this institution to a position of eminence in the hospital field."

William L. Collins, vice president of St. James Mercy Hospital Board of Managers, paid tribute to Sister M. Aquinas, superintendent, and Dr. O. K. Stewart, president of the board.

"The two persons," Mr. Collins said, "have used the medical profession, not as a means to live, but to serve the community."

Dr. Stewart responded briefly by expressing hope that the "friendly spirit among the Sisters, doctors, nurses and personnel and the trustees" would continue.

SISTER AQUINAS was greeted with sustained applause as she stood to acknowledge Mr. Collins' remarks. She said, simply, "Thank you—I could have done nothing without you."

Mr. Collins paid tribute to John Mullinger, chairman of the fund-raising drive and Attorney Sherman Shultz, Arthur J. Baker, William G. Holland and Mrs. Francis Cameron of the Women's Board, who were division chairmen in the campaign.

DR. GEORGE TAYLOR, president of St. James Mercy Hospital medical staff, said, "This is our workshop. We accept the responsibility to give Hornell as good medical service as can be given in the United States."

Miss Anna Heikavitt, superintendent of nurses, was commended by several of the speakers for "her competent and cheerful handling of the mass of details" involved in a building program.

on duty conducted the tour. Personnel of each department was on hand to explain the new equipment to the visitors.

Actual construction of the new wing was started October 3, 1940, under specifications by Weasdrop and Northrup of Rochester, architects. The contractors were Swarthout and Rowley of Rochester with Floyd Klein as general superintendent.

WITH THE NEW addition, the hospital will have a 145-bed capacity. On the ground floor of the new wing is a modern kitchen; laundry and service departments; a relocated steam heat plant, gas-fired; an emergency lighting system; Sisters of Mercy dining room.

Special diet kitchen, linen storage room, housekeeper's office, nurses' dressing rooms and storage rooms equipped with walk-in refrigerators.

THE MAIN entrance on the first floor leads to a spacious lobby. In one nook of the lobby is the new Aquinas Gift Shop, which will be operated by St. James Mercy Hospital Women's Board.

Administrative, business and school of nursing offices, a medical record room, a doctors' lounge and conference room, a X-ray suite and an emergency room all are located on the first floor.

Patients' rooms are on the second and third floors. On the combined floors are 34 adult beds. Each of the floors also has a conference room, diet kitchen, nurses' station and solarium.

The fourth floor is occupied by a completely new surgical department, which includes three major operating rooms and an eye, ear, nose and throat operating room.

It also houses a cryoscopy suite, a patients' recovery room, doctors' and nurses' dressing rooms; supervisor's office; a central sterilization and sterile storage unit and instrument room.

Benedictine Monastery Opened To Public; Monks Greet Bishop From Sweden on Visit

Monks of Mount Saviour, located six miles outside of Elmira, began the full observance of their Benedictine Rule and were hosts to the Most Rev. Ansgar Nelson, O.S.B., Coadjutor to the Vicar Apostolic of Sweden during the past week.

The monks formally took occupancy of the temporary building which will serve as their monastery.

The entire Divine Office was chanted in choir and High Mass celebrated each morning. Singing of Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament takes place each Sunday afternoon at 5 p.m.

VISITORS ARE invited to visit the Chapel or attend the services. Vespers are sung daily at 8:30 p.m.

At the present there are six members of the Community, four priests and two brothers. Other postulants are expected around the latter part of this month.

A number of retreatants, both priests and laymen have visited Mount Saviour and many applications have been received for the summer.

A group of young men have volunteered their services to assist the community in getting the grounds in order to assist with the farm work.

Superior of the new Monastery is the Very Rev. Dom Damasius Winzen and superior is Rev. Dom Gregory Borgstedt.

BISHOP NELSON, on a lecture tour of this country made a special trip to inspect the new Benedictine foundation on the hill overlooking the picturesque Chemung Valley.

A convert to the Catholic faith Bishop Nelson told the monks that he entered the Benedictine order in 1930. He studied in Scotland and Germany completing his studies at Portmouth Priory, E. I.

Ordained to the Priesthood in 1936 by Bishop Francis P. Krough a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester and now Archbishop of Baltimore the Benedictine Father was elevated to the Bishopric in 1947 and left immediately for his See in Sweden.

THE DIocese of Sweden is a Missionary country of over 170,000 square miles with a total population of 7 million people. Of this number there are but 16,000 Catholics and 10,000 of these are refugees from Poland, Latvia, Estonia, Hungary and Czechoslovakia, he said.

Eleven parishes and 13 Mission churches comprise the entire facilities to take care of the spiritual needs of the Catholics in Sweden. A total of 40 priests have charge of these parishes and Missions.

Bishop Nelson asked for the prayers of the American people in this important period of history.

Elmiran Elected By Fraternity

John B. Lawless of Elmira was elected president of Theta Kappa Phi national social fraternity for Catholic men in secular and Catholic colleges and universities at the group's 15th national convention at Hotel General Brock, Niagara Falls, N. Y.

Most Rev. Eugene J. McElroy, bishop of Oklahoma City was reappointed national chaplain.

The organization reported 3000 members and alumni including nationally known names such as James A. Farley, former postmaster general.

The 4-day sessions drew members from as far west as Oklahoma and as far east as Louisiana.

Theta Kappa Phi was founded 11 years ago especially for Catholic men in secular and state universities but has since expanded into Catholic institutions.

Nobility Titles Out On Bishops' Insignia

Vatican City (AP)—Bishops Ordinals have been forbidden to use any titles of nobility or decorations connected with them in their coats of arms, insignia or seals of office, according to a decree issued here by the Sacred Consistorial Congregation. The decree was published in Acta Apostolicae Sedis, the official publication of the Holy See.

Hornell Hospital Changes Planned

Hornell—Maternity and pediatric departments, a pharmacy department, a pathology laboratory will be housed in the old plant of St. James Mercy Hospital. It was announced here last week.

The changes, already under way, are scheduled to be completed within four months.

The new maternity department will be on the second floor of the South Wing of the old building. One end will house two delivery rooms, a nurses' station and a doctors' lounge.

Two three-bed wards will be installed in the present operating and sterilizing rooms on the second floor of the original building. Two nine-basin nurseries and a nursery for premature babies will replace other operating and central supply rooms.

A pediatric department with a 15-bed and crib capacity will occupy the first floor space formerly assigned to the maternity department. Steel partitions will divide this into four-crib cubicles.

THE PHARMACY and laboratory will be readily accessible to both the old building and the new wing.

The pharmacy, with a large drug storage space and prescriptions and dispensary room, will replace the men's ward now on the first floor of the old building. The pathological laboratory will

be where, the old kitchen and cafeteria now are located on the first floor. It will contain a bacteriology and serology room, a washing and sterilizing room, a general laboratory and an office.

The space in the front of this section now occupied by the admissions desk and offices will be converted into living quarters for the Sisters of Mercy.

Picnic of St. Mary's Hospital central staff was to be held Thursday this week, in Genesee Valley Park.

Equipment for the two-room department is now being installed. Dr. Kenneth T. Rowe, urologist, said today it would be completely set up by the first part of next week.

The cystoscopy suite, located on the fourth floor of the addition, has both diagnostic and surgical facilities.

On the fourth floor is a fully equipped X-ray room and dark room which will be used for cystoscopy, operating room and fracture pictures.
