Ground Breaking Slated For Benedictine Monastery

subject to the Most Rev. Dom Bernard Kallis, O. S. B., Abbot Primate of the Benedictine Order, who resides in Rome. His authority is exercised through the Very Rev. Dom Georges Marceau, O. S. B., Prior of the Monastery of St. Demetrius-Lac, just north of the Vermont border in Canada.

Some also pointed permission for the Benedictine erection of a novitiate (training school or seminary). Many aspirants have applied and a novice and several postulants are now staying at Mount Saviour. After six months they will receive their final training in a novitiate for one year at St. Benedict-Lac.

THE NEW CHAPEL, on which work will begin next month, will be unique in shape and plan for such buildings in the United States.

It will be octagonal (eight-sided) with the altar standing in the center in order that those who stand at Mass may be near the Roman reredos (the "apostles") (those who stand about the altar).

The monks of Mount Saviour follow the monastic tradition originated by Abbot Prosper Guéranger of Solesmes in France. His aim was the restoration of the purely monastic ideal laid down by St. Benedict.

For this reason Abbot Guéranger and his followers did not take over schools or parishes but concentrated on the apostolate of the liturgy. Solesmes became famous through the work the Abbey did for the restoration of Gregorian Chant. Maria Laach became the center for the liturgical movement in Germany.

The Mount Saviour monks intend to follow in the footsteps of the Solesmes tradition without, however, neglecting manual labor, one of the most important elements in the monastic life promulgated by St. Benedict in the fifth of the last century.

In addition to agriculture, the Elmhurst monks will engage in carpentry, wood carving, pottery and other crafts.

ALREADY volunteer workers from many sections of the East have found their way to Mount Saviour to join with the monks in helping prepare the way for the greater monastery to come.

College students and seminarians on vacation and Oblate groups have given their assistance. The guest list shows home addresses as New York, Boston, Brooklyn and other places in New England and New Jersey.

Among the volunteers drawing special appreciation from the monks are Robert Latour of Boston, Al Class of Long Island and Vincent Clemente of Brooklyn.

Starting as a trickle, more and more visitors are coming to Mount Saviour to inspect the property and chat with the monks.

Chanting of Vespers at 5 p.m. each afternoon finds the small oratory at times barely sufficient to accommodate the number of lay worshippers. On Sundays after Vespers, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is given. The public is welcome.
