Sisters of St. Francis and the many Rochester friends who have made annual retreats with her at Stella Niagara are mourning the death of one of the outstanding retreatants there, Mrs. M. J. Gillies.

Mrs. Gillies died at the age of 86 on July 20, 1961, the Feast of St. Elias the Prophet and founder of the Carmelite Order and her death occurred also within the octave of the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.

Bohemian Funeral Mass was offered at the Stella Niagara Chapel by Rev. William A. Helm, chaplain, assisted by priests from Niagara University. Interment was in Stella Niagara Cemetery on July 21.

A permanent resident at Stella Niagara who had made retreats there for more than 30 years, she is remembered by fellow retreatants for her gracious

manner and kindly smile. Her spiritual help to all who sought it is so remembered.

She was the mother of Mother Eugene of the Holy Spirit, Discalced Carmelite and Prioress of the Wheeling, West Virginia Carmel, who died in 1924.

Mrs. Gillies was an ardent member of the Third Order of Discalced Carmelites and urged many to follow its rules.
