Belgium IOC Aide Stella Niagara Retreatant, Coming To Youth Meet At Ithaca

James Meert, attorney of the International Office of the Young Christian Workers (IOC) of Brussels, Belgium, will be one of the European delegates to the World Assembly of Youth, scheduled at Cornell University, Ithaca, August 8 to 14.

Stella Niagara friends who have made annual retreats with her at Stella Niagara are mourning the death of one of the outstanding retreatants there, Mrs. M. J. Gillies.

Mr. Meert arrived in the United States on July 18 for a four-month tour of the U.S. and Canada under the auspices of the State Department's Exchange of Persons Division. During his tour Mr. Meert, who is also head of the study services of the IOC in Belgium, will study labor unions and visit factories in such cities as Detroit, Pittsburgh and Toledo.

Mrs. Gillies died at the age of 84 on July 20, 1938, the Feast of St. Elias. She was the mother of Mother Eugenie of the Holy Spirit, Discalced Carmelite and Prioress of the Wheeling, West Virginia Carmel, who died in 1924.

THE VANGUARD of 500 delegates to the World Assembly of Youth from nearly 60 countries arriving in New York included Patrick Keegan, a British textile worker, who is secretary general of the Young Christian Workers, of whom Cassius Joseph Carlin of Belgium is founder and chairman general. The worldwide IOC has 1,750,000 members. Mr. Meert is a former secretary general of the group.

A permanent resident at Stella Niagara who had made retreats there for more than 20 years, she is remembered by fellow retreatants for her gracious manner and kindly smile. Her spiritual help to all who sought it is so remembered.
