# Children Barred From Altar Rail

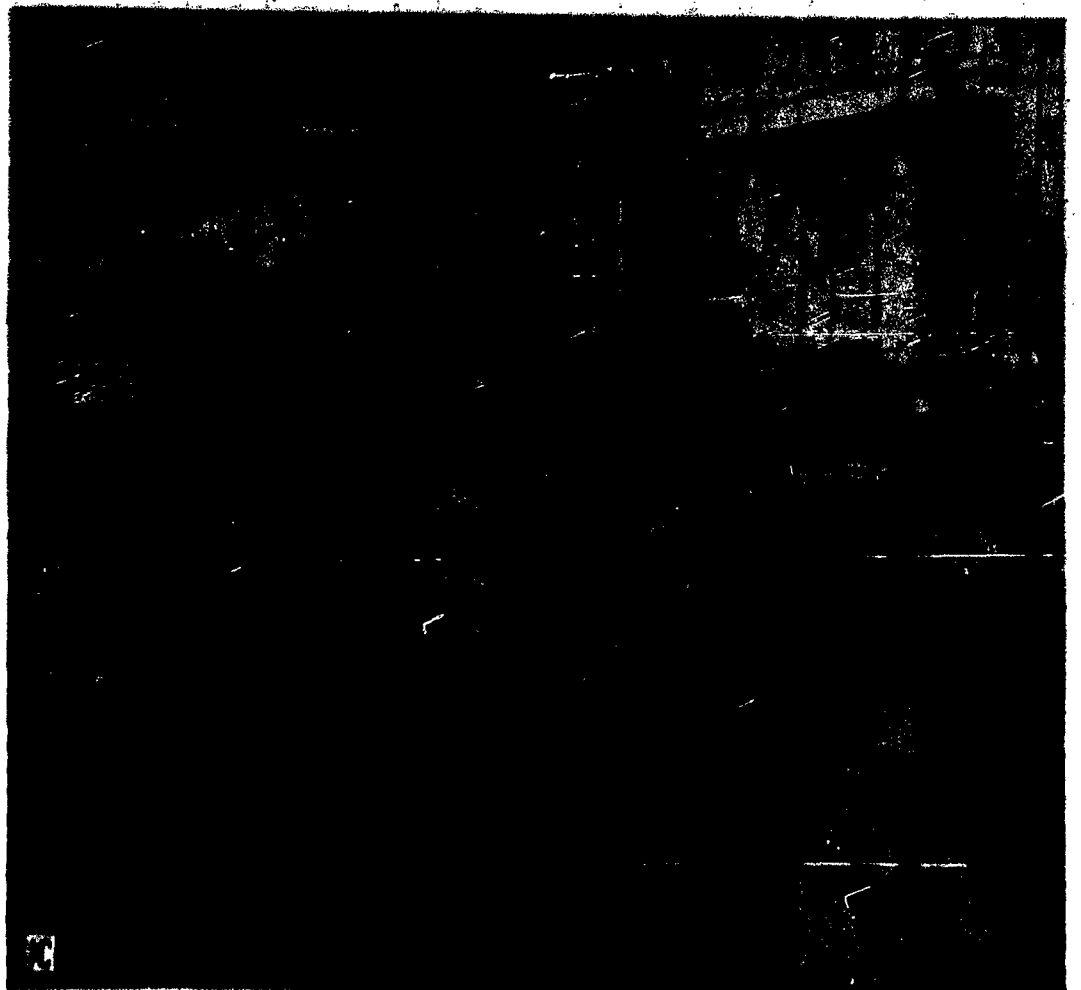
Frankfurt, Germany — (NC) — In enforcement of the decree issued by the Supreme Congregation of the Holy Office which enjoined the faithful upon further visits to Holy Communion, the children had refused to comply with the instructions of the Archbishop and had continued to visit the altar where they claimed to have had numerous "apparitions" of the Blessed Virgin two years ago.

ON THE more strength of the children's claims, and despite repeated warnings from the German and Swiss hierarchy, thousands had visited Heroldsbach in the last two years.

Meanwhile, the Rev. Johann Gallier, priest in Heroldsbach, who had given the children at least moral support, has resigned. The population of Heroldsbach has long been divided in appreciating the "visions" which ecclesiastical authorities had declared spurious from the very outset.

Nearly two years ago a commission appointed by Archbishop Kois found that the children were victims of "old" experiences, but clever promoters used them to produce a lucrative business, feeding thousands of credulous people, including even priests, who flagrantly disregarded the bishops' guidance.

# Catholics Urged To Penetrate U. N. Agencies

Utrecht, Netherlands — (NC) Catholics must penetrate more into the fabric of the various United Nations agencies, P.J.S. Serrarens, secretary-general of the International Federation of Christian Trade Unions, said here in an address before the Catholic Society for Spiritual Renewal.

REPORTS AND activities of these U. N. agencies scarcely ever testify to the Christian conscience, he said. He pointed out the activities of Dr. G. Breck Chisholm, director-general of the U. N. World Health Organization, who, Mr. Serrarens said, opposed the Christian convictions of good and evil and propagated indifference.

Dr. Chisholm was provided with the occasion to do so, Mr. Serrarens went on, because neither Catholics nor Christians in general exert any influence in the World Health Organization.

"As to these U. N. agencies," continued Mr. Serrarens, "Catholics have a great task. We must not hide our principles and opinions among our own people. To the contrary, we must learn how to exercise influence on their decisions, which are binding upon the affiliated nations. We must assert our rights. . . . We must fight also for the preservation of Christianity in particular, for the preservation of the values which are sacred to us, and we must keep on fighting for the acknowledgement of the law of Christ all over the world."

# Hiroshima Catholics Increase 900% Since Atom-Bomb

Hiroshima, (NC) — The city of Hiroshima now has 1200 Catholics as compared with 120 six years ago, 900 per cent increase, it was revealed in connection with the inaugural Mass celebrated by Archbishop Maximilian de Furstenberg, Apostolic Delegate to Japan, in the Peace Memorial Church here. A Mass of Requiem was offered for Hiroshima's 24 Catholic atom-bomb victims and for all who died in World War II.

With no roof and with the walls raised only to two-thirds of their ultimate height, the church, crowded as it was with 1,000 persons including the relatives of the Catholic atom-bomb victims, is a prophecy in cement and steel foreshadowing better things to come.

# British Zone Anglican Church Charged To Occupation Cost

Frankfurt — (NC) — Expenses amounting to \$4,000,000 (about \$10,000,000) in connection with the building of an Anglican church in the British zone of occupation were charged to occupation costs, according to a report of Finance News Service, of Frankfurt, Germany. Other items mentioned in this connection are a visiting plane for 75,000 Marks (about \$18,000) and a telephone post for 7,000 Marks.
