

# Break With Russia Satellites Urged

Washington, Pa. (NC) — A complete diplomatic and political break by the United States with Russia and the Soviet bloc was advocated in a resolution adopted at the annual convention of the Knights of Columbus.

The resolution also called for the withdrawal of American troops from all foreign lands, including Yugoslavia. The resolution pointed out that in these nations "such as Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Rumania, Bulgaria, Poland, Yugoslavia, and the Soviet Union, the United States should withdraw its troops and should support the people in their struggle for freedom and independence."

The resolution urged that "the government of the United States, in keeping with its historic traditions and its sacred obligations, should give its full support to the people of these nations in their struggle for freedom and independence."

The delegates voted to hold the 1952 convention in Los Angeles beginning on August 3. The convention adopted a resolution which noted the 60th anniversary of Pope Leo's XIII's Encyclical "Rerum Novarum" and the 20th anniversary of Pope Pius XI's Encyclical "Quadragesimo Anno" and urged that all citizens seriously study "the saving principles expounded in the Encyclical and apply them to the present and the future of the people and the application of them in their relations with their fellow men to the end that the social order may be reconstructed according to Christian standards and existing social evils, which invite communist exploitation, may be eliminated."

## Non-Sectarian College Hails K. of C. Ads

Pittsburgh — (NC) — Non-sectarian Woodbury College of Los Angeles has awarded a trophy to the Knights of Columbus for its Catholic advertising program, which the college called out standing for its "consistent good taste," the K. of C. convention was told.

Supreme Advocate Luke E. Hart of St. Louis, chairman of the advertising committee, reported to the convention that Woodbury College "made its selection on the basis of an objective comparison of the Supreme Council's advertising with all forms and kinds of advertising appearing in national magazines."

THE K. of C. official noted that at first some publishers feared the ads might bring on "an acrimonious religious controversy."

Giving statistics on the advertising program, Mr. Hart said "I believe that you will agree that our Catholic advertising program is outstanding not only for its good taste—but also for its good results."

"As of July 31st, the Supreme Council's advertising had brought in \$29,613 requests for Catholic literature," he reported. "This is a gain of \$64,919 since my report to you at the last Supreme Convention."

This year, he revealed, secular publications with a combined circulation "well into the 30 millions" will carry K. of C. ads explaining briefly some point of Catholic belief and offering free pamphlets and instructions courses to those who write in.

## Czech Peasant Attempt To Free Priests Revealed

Vienna — (RNS) — Crude, armed Slovak peasants tried unsuccessfully last fall to free some 300 Roman Catholic clergymen from a Communist concentration camp in Czechoslovakia, it was revealed here by a priest who escaped from the country.

In an interview with the Neue Wiener Tagesschau, Vienna daily, the priest said that the liberation attempt was made by hundreds of peasants and shepherds from the high Tatra mountain area in Slovakia.

## Governor Backs Priest School Board Head

Providence, R. I. — (RNS) — Gov. Dennis J. Roberts has upheld the election of a Roman Catholic priest as chairman of the new Rhode Island State Board of Education.

Election of the Rev. Cornelius B. Collins of St. Bernard's church, North Kingstown, had been criticized as "inconsiderate and suspicious" in a sermon by the Rev. Norman S. Townsend, pastor of the Quiddamett Baptist church in the same town.

IN BACKING Father Collins, Governor Roberts told the Baptist pastor that the seven member board supervises standards to both public and private schools.

The governor, who appointed the priest to the board, said "Father Collins is an outstanding citizen of our state and has had a vast experience in the field of education. Members of the board subsequently elected him as chairman."

In his sermon, Mr. Townsend claimed that, as a priest of the Church, Father Collins is dedicated to follow papal encyclicals and canon law, including those relating to the education of children.

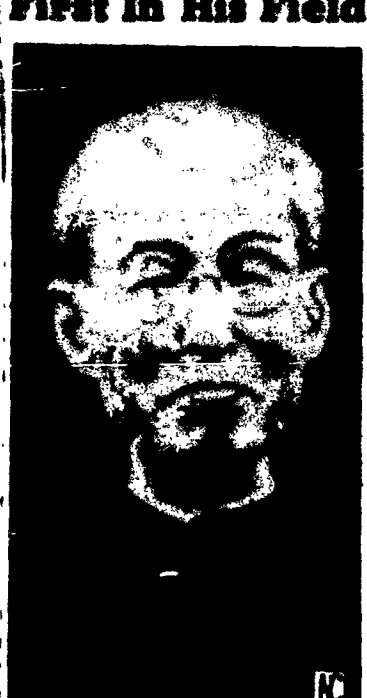
HE ALSO contended that the Catholic Church attempts to undermine public education by seeking legislative sanction for free transportation, textbooks, lunches and other services for parochial school pupils.

The Baptist pastor also announced the opening in September of a kindergarten at his church "to help locally those Protestant parents who have been sending their children to the parochial kindergarten" at Father Collins' church. (North Kingstown has no public kindergarten.)

Father Collins was elected chairman of the state education board last June 28 by fellow members on the nomination of a layman. The nomination was seconded by the Rev. John B. Lyte, rector of All Saints' Episcopal church here.

## Bishop Haas Urges Teachers To Unite

Grand Rapids, Mich. — (NC) — The nation's teachers should "unite in their own organizations in a dignified way" as one of the best bulwarks against the inroads of communism, Bishop Francis J. Haas of Grand Rapids declared in an address before the 34th annual convention of the American Federation of Teachers here.



The Rev. Paul Tsuchihashi, S.J., 60-year-old former president of Sophia University Tokyo, celebrated the 50th anniversary of his ordination on August 24. A convert from Buddhism, he joined the Society of Jesus 64 years ago. Although a Japanese, Father Tsuchihashi studied for years in China and is regarded as one of the foremost scholars of Chinese literature and the greatest living authority on Chinese character writing.

"I am not urging teachers to use the strike weapon," Bishop Haas said. "They have a number of other weapons they can use very effectively other than the strike. There is for example the exertion of legitimate pressure on public officials for decent appropriations for teachers' salaries. In a word, without organization there can be only subservience for teachers and subservience for our future citizens."

Bishop Haas told the convention that his conception of social justice is the requirement of every man and woman to service the community in proportion to his or her ability. He added: "If the individual's ability to serve is less, his responsibility is less. Manifestly, in a democratic society like our own, all are required to give in proportion to what has been given them. This is the concept of social justice I offer for your consideration."

THE BISHOP said that his understanding of the phrase "subservience of our future citizens" involves the training of children in today's classrooms to take part in an organized way in the training to fit them for everyday work and occupations.

Referring to the organization of teachers, Bishop Haas said he was not proposing that the teacher-conduct special courses in unionism. He added: "Indeed curriculum limitations would make such procedure impossible, and school policy make it unwise. But these and other obstacles can and must be overcome, for organization is a 'sine qua non' of any plan for internal well-being and indeed for international well-being."
