One Saturday they saw the chaplain's flag flying over Father Wilson's tent, and asked a young seminarian, John Choi, who is now attached to the 15th AAA Battalion, if 30 or 40 of the villagers could attend Mass the next day. Father Wilson knew the chapel tent would be a little overcrowded so he investigated and found there were almost 200 Catholics in the vicinity.

After the meal, entertainment was in order. The orientals sang a few songs, and then the Catholics sang for their supper in solos and with the whole group. Then came dancing performed by four Korean girls and after that some more singing by all.

Geneva Legion Approves Home Sale To K. of C.

Geneva — Purchase by Geneva Council, Knights of Columbus of the former American Legion Home at 39 Milton St., for \$21,500 has been approved by members of Winnet Post Corporation.

The home was offered for sale, according to Robert Snyder, president of the Corporation, when the post moved into its new home on Lochland Road. The new home was formerly a retreat house conducted by the Redemptorist Fathers and was bought by the Legion for \$35,000.

The program consists of the morning offering and other prayers, appropriate hymns, and a short talk by one of the Jesuits assigned to the work of the Sacred Heart League.

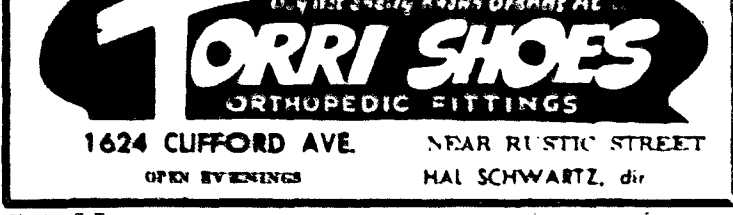
