## Rites For Daniel Sheehan, Distinguished Elmiran, Set

Solemn High Mass of Requiem for Daniel Sheehan, Sr., distinguished Catholic layman and for 50 years a leader in Elmira's civic, business and fraternal life, will be held, this morning, August 31, at 10 a.m. in St. Mary's Church, Elmira.

Mr. Sheehan, 90, died Tuesday, August 28, 1951 at 11:15 a.m. at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, after a long illness. He had been in retirement for more than 15 years when stricken with a stroke, last Friday. The body was taken to the Charles F. Hughes and Son Funeral Home from where the funeral will be held.

A member of St. Joseph's Hospital advisory committee, Mr. Sheehan had served on its building committee.

THE SISTERS of St. Joseph at the hospital issued the following statement following his death:

"In the passing of Daniel Sheehan Sr., St. Joseph's Hospital has lost one of its best friends and benefactors of its early days. Through the years he showed great interest in our welfare."

"Mr. Sheehan promoted baseball games for the benefit of the institution and befriended us in many other ways for which we are most grateful."

"May God in His goodness grant to this noble soul eternal rest."

## Ten Florida Students To Enter Seminary

Marking capacity attendance, 208 students, will enter St. Andrew's Seminary for the opening of school; the high school department on Wednesday, Sept. 5 and the college department on Sept. 12, according to the Rev. Dr. Maynard J. Connell, rector.

The students will be the second group to enjoy the advantages of the newly constructed Seminary building on Buffalo Road which was made ready for occupancy at the opening of school last year.

AMONG THE NEW students will be 10 young men from the Diocese of St. Augustine, Florida. They will join the young men from the Dioceses of Rochester, Albany and Syracuse who are making their preparatory studies for the priesthood.

Joining the faculty after two years study at the Collegio Angelicum in Rome will be the Rev. Joseph Lloyd Hogan who will teach Religion and Latin.

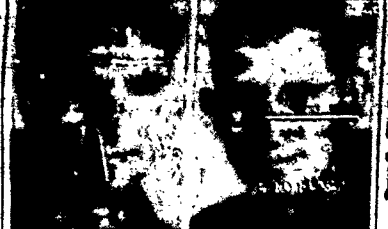

REV. ROGER MATZARETH



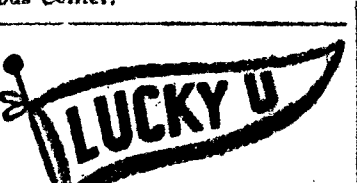

## 170 Students To Set Record At Catholic High

A preliminary check on Parish school registration in Elmira indicates that a slight increase will be noted in the schools within the city limits.

St. Anthony's school will show a 10% increase over last year, with an expected enrollment of 300. Next in line is St. Mary's with an anticipated registration of 250, following a 5% increase for this year.

ALL OTHER schools report registration figures to be about the same as last year, thus insuring that about 1000 children will report for the school year beginning September 5. According to a statement released by Rev. William A. Burns, principal of Elmira Catholic High School, the registration at that place will reach an all-time high with 170 students prepared to continue their studies at the school headed by Father Burns and administratively staffed by Sisters of St. Joseph and Sisters of Mercy.
