They feel the Japanese should be made to pay for the damage done by the aggression of their millitary leaders. On the other hand, there are those, and some of them are here in this city, who wonder if we are not being too severe with Japan. The reason for their doubts is that they feel Japan's economy is in such a desperate shape that, even without any outside burdens, it may not be able to "make the grade," and may yet fail prey to comnumber from within.

In February, 1918, he went to Czechoslovakia under the GI BIII of Rights to study the Slovak language and literature at the state university at Bratislava in Slovakia. DURING MIS brief career at the university he became an interpreter for the U.S. consulate general at Brazialaya, and Congressman Rodino said that it was through this employment that he was accused of explonege for the U.S. and arrested that October. Despite repeated efforts of the U.S. Embusy and the consulate general, he was detained without trial for seven months.
