(Continued from Page 7) believe that the existing order and American conditions in general were beyond all criticism," he said. Mr. Matt added that "it was many years before any other Catholic societies and organizations" followed the Central Verein's example.

IN A RESOLUTION on drug addiction among youth the Central Verein said: "Penal laws and police action while good in themselves cannot solve this problem. Almighty God, and His natural and divinely revealed law, must reign in the homes and schools of our nation before this tragic evil can be eradicated."

Delegates to the 56th annual meeting of the Catholic Verein's New York State Branch and the 32nd annual convention of the Catholic Women's Union state group met at the Hendrick Hotel in Troy. Bernard F. Jensen, state president of the Verein noting where in the code of morality is attacked in his annual message at Germania Hall said:

"DO NOT HIDE your light under a bushel—but radiate your Catholic teaching whenever the rights and dignity of the church are infringed. In this way we aid in creating the Christian sense of moral values and help reconstruct society."

The Rev. Ermin Kaus, O. F. M., vicar of the Friary and professor at Selma College, forecast that the Catholic Women's Union would "in the next fifty years have a worldwide effect." National president Sattler at the banquet said:

"The qualifications of the lay apostle are an unfeigned faith, that is a sincere charity, the love of God and neighbor, and finally an apostolic zeal, a self-sacrificing devotion to the cause."
