

Mrs. Ryan of 336 Elliott Street died August 28, 1951.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. Leo V. Smith, pastor, in Our Lady of Good Counsel Church following services at Henry D. Halloran Sons, 141 Arnett Blvd.
